Great Lumber Cargoes. Three lumber cargoes were cleared yesterday, the total shipment for the day reaching nearly 2,000,000 feet. Of the three cargoes, one, that of the steamer Despatch, was not listed at the customs house prior to the close of business, but she will take something like three-quarters of a million feet. The other vessels clearing yesterday were the schooners Salvador and Melrose. Both are bound for San Pedro. The Salvador took on her cargo at St. Helens. She is a vessel of 286 tons, and carries on her present trip 504,831 feet of lumber. The Melrose was loaded at Vancouver. She registers 542 tons and takes 825,417 feet of lumber. The Melrose had considerable difficulty in the upper river, having been loaded so deeply that she could not get away from Vancouver. It was necessary to dredge her out of the pocket.—Daily Astorian.

Getting Ahead of the Butchers. By the simple process of sprinkling the dealer cannot sell it after it being tainted, the city board of health hopes to make the sale of such meat impossible. At its meeting yesterday the board decided to ask Corporation Counsel Judson for an opinion as to whether it will be lawful for meat inspectors to sprinkle with kerosene oil meat which he condemns. For some time the city has been paying a scavenger \$12 a month for carrying away condemned meat, so that the dealer cannot sell it after it is condemned. The kerosene plan is followed in several Eastern cities, and when meat is once sprinkled with it, it is impossible, of course, for the dealer to dispose of it.—Spokesman-Review.

Wasco County Tax Levy. It is believed that the tax levy this year for county purposes will be 25 mills, which, on the assessed value of property—\$4,640,800, will yield a revenue of \$116,020, and adding to the amount of taxes for state purposes apportioned to this county, \$28,565, an increase of \$10,881 over last year, will make a total of \$144,685 to be raised by taxes in Wasco county. The state levy will be \$10,881 more than last year, by reason of the appropriation for the Dalles-Celilo canal and portage railroad, and Wasco will reap the full benefit of it, because the money will be spent in this city and vicinity.—The Dalles Chronicle.

Baker City Light Cheap. The price paid for lighting Baker City is not high when compared with prices and conditions in cities of like size in the United States. The mayor of Mishawaka, Indiana, took the trouble to compile statistics of 64 small cities ranging in population from 5,000 to 11,000. Considering the amount of investment and the number of acres contracted for Baker City citizens have no right to complain at the prices she has to pay. The city pays \$7.50 an acre by the month or \$90 a year for each acre. There is more than \$200,000 invested in the Baker City plant, while the highest amount invested in the city of other cities have less than \$50,000 invested.—Baker City Herald.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Scrubbing porcelain or enamel bathtubs with any soap containing sand thins and cracks the enamel. Do not use a polished table every day, as it should be kept spotless. There is too much trouble involved in keeping it in order. A glass bottle in spirits of wine will make a transparent cement which will unite broken glass so as to render the fracture almost imperceptible. All the life will come back to an old-fashioned quilt which has become hard and lost its elasticity if you will hang it in the sun for a few hours. If the wick of a lamp does not move easily in the holder, draw out one or two threads from one side. The wick should be as large a one as the holder will receive. An easy way to clean lamp chimneys is to hold them for a moment in the steam from a boiling kettle, rub dry with a clean cloth and polish with a soft newspaper. To keep out moths use alum. Wash over the crevices of store boxes with alum water and sprinkle powdered alum wherever it is suspected that moths may make their appearance. If there be one principle more than another to be observed in packing it is that the heavy things go at the bottom of the trunk, even though one is sure that it is to stand on end half of the trip. Transforming a Couch.
