BEEF TRUST'S DEAL

WILL MAKE GREAT FEED GROUNDS IN SOUTH.

Four Packing Companies Buy One Million Acres of Pine Land in Florida and Alabama at \$3.75 per Acre—They Will Make it the Future Reserve Feeding Ground for the Trust.

Montgomery, Ala., Jan. 18.—One of the greatest land deals in the history of the South has been closed, by which the four members of the great packing trust, Swift, Armour, Nelson Morris and Schwarzhild & Salberger, purchased 1,000,000 acres of pine and swamp lands from the Louisville & Nashville Railway at \$3.75 per acre, or a total of \$3,750,000.

The deal has started stock yards and packers throughout the land, as it is the beginning of a revolution in the feeder industry. This tract of land will be made a feeding ground by the owners, from which trainloads of fat stock can be shipped on a moment's notice to any of the large plants operated by the trust.

The land abounds in pine timber and swamp bottoms covered with luxuriant grass and thousands of acres are covered with cassava, the rich southern plant, which has proved so valuable as a fat producer. Cattle live on it as hogs live and fatten on mast and this vast area will be converted into a veritable home feed yard for the trust. Feeders will be bought up in the Western market centers and corn will be shipped by the trainload. A supply for a year in advance will be kept on hand so the trust will not need to enter the fat stock market at all, but will keep their own feeders coming on for the daily needs of their plants, and will be independent of the shippers from the ranges of the West and the feed lots of the East and Central states.

The trust has contracted with the Alabama Agricultural College to plant the entire tract to cassava, and when this is done, there will be no limit to the number of cattle this 1,000,000 acres will support.

It is also rumored that the largest packing plant in the world will be erected at the feed ground, to save the cost of transporting fat stock from the grounds to the packing houses. It means the revolution of the cattle feeding business and the stock yards companies and commission men in the market centers are alarmed.

News Notes and Comment From the Great Metropolis.

New York, Jan. 18.—Dr. Parkhurst is already certain in his mind that the administration of the police department will demand his remedial attention and a fund of \$100,000 is being raised to enable the Society for the Prevention of Crime to collect evidence of wrongdoing in and out of the police department. In the meantime Police Commissioner McAdoo is attending to business and there is yet no evidence that he was not sincere when he promised that the laws shall be honestly enforced.

An idea of the expense of running a city like New York may be obtained from a comparative statement just issued by Comptroller Grout showing the amounts that have been drawn from the city treasury and the sinking funds, by warrants, in the last six years. Nearly \$320,000,000 was spent during 1903, though the budget was only \$97,000,000. The excess was due to expenditures for public improvement not included in the budget. In 1898, the first year of consolidation, and incidentally the first year of the Tammany regime under Mayor Van Wyck, the city spent in the same manner \$154,486,518.

Not in many years has this city had so many snow storms, and so severe, as this winter. The new plan is for the merchant who gives the stamps to have them redeemable in merchandise bought in his own store, or where it is preferred several merchants may combine and have the stamps redeemable in cash. It is urged that under these plans there is no possibility of deception as to the value of the prizes to be given for the stamps, and no discrimination, as any merchant may avail himself of the system.
