### GENERAL NEWS.

The fight for Sunday closing of the St. Louis fair has begun in congress by a bill to that effect being introduced by Senator Platt, of Connecticut.

Preferential tariffs and steamship subsidies between Australia and Canada, to cripple the trade of the United States with both countries, is one result of the American tariff policy.

Americans have contracted to finish in three years a 60-mile railroad from the Gulf coast directly west to the interior of Guatemala. Its completion will revolutionize Guatemalan commerce.

There are 100,000 destitute people in Macedonia this winter. All forecasts are to the effect that next spring will witness either a successful rebellion of the Balkan provinces or virtual extermination of those peoples.

There is great chagrin at St. Petersburg over the new American-Chinese commercial treaty, as indicating possible anti-Russian sentiment in America, and as being an obstruction in Russia's march of oriental conquest.

William McGrath, aged 23, died a few days ago in a New York hospital, with every superficial and vital indication of extreme old age, shown by his appearance and by a post-mortem examination. The case has only two or three recorded parallels.

The steel trust "went in partnership" two years ago with a large number of its employees, selling them stock at \$82.50. The combine has been a losing game steadily, and now the management offers to recoup the employees by—selling them more stock at \$55.

### NORTHWEST NEWS.

The tax levy in Baker county is 37 mills this year, or 7 mills higher than last year.

Salem baseball fans are taking steps to reorganize the Willamette Valley Baseball League.

Civil service examinations for clerks and carriers in the postoffice will be held at Baker City on Saturday, January 23.

Jacob Schmidt, an aged tree pruner, was run down and fatally injured by a Southern Pacific yard engine in Portland Monday.

Two highwaymen held up a Chinese laundry on Sixth street, in Portland, Monday morning, in broad daylight, securing \$10 in cash.

Whitney, Baker county, is now on the map. The county court has appointed J. Rosenthal as justice of the peace and Pat Turley as constable.

Spokane will be the headquarters for the new Northwestern Baseball League, comprised of the teams of Spokane, Butte, Salt Lake and Ogden.

Twenty-five feet of ground 100 feet deep, on Fifth street, in Portland, was sold Monday for \$1,000 per foot, a raise in price of about 30 per cent in a year.

San Francisco police have discovered a deep plot by which several persons were first heavily insured and then murdered. Leon Soeder, one of the arch-fiends in the plot, has been arrested.

The Portland Ministerial Association has passed resolutions asking congress to grant an appropriation for the Lewis and Clark fair, only on the grounds that the fair be closed every Sunday.

August Erickson, owner of the famous Erickson saloon and theater in Portland, is under arrest for running a "21" game. The complaint was sworn out by a Mrs. Fishbeck, whose husband lost all his wages and some of her savings in the game.

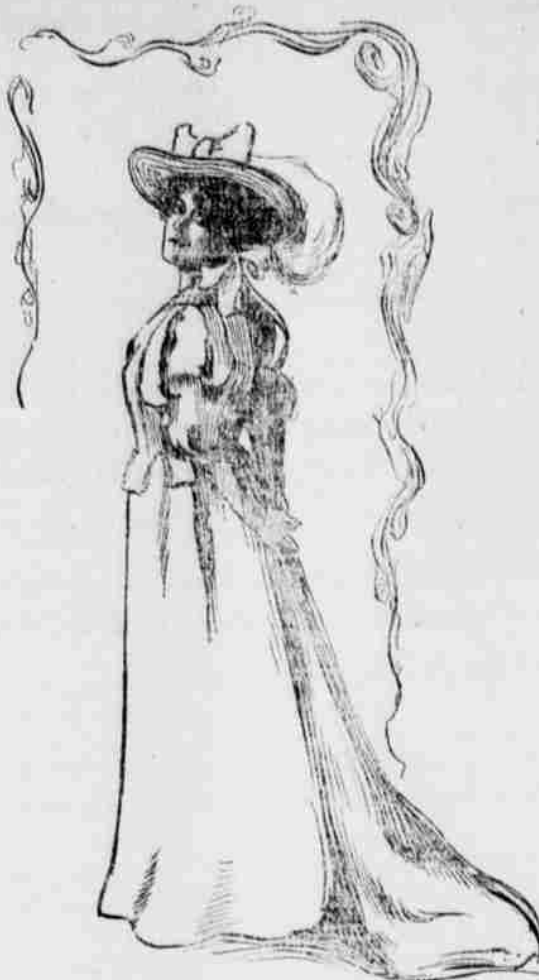

## BOARD OF TRADE

CONSIDERING MANY MATTERS OF BUSINESS.

Question of One Cent Postage, Reciprocity With Canada and Extension of Power to the Interstate Commerce Commission All Up for Discussion—Fifty Local Boards of Trade Represented.

Washington, D. C. Jan. 19.—The National Board of Trade began its thirty-fourth annual meeting here today. About fifty commercial bodies are represented by 150 delegates. The program of the meeting, which will occupy three days, contemplates the discussion of a wide range of subjects.

Among the many resolutions adopted by some one or another of the constituent bodies for discussion at the meeting are those favoring one cent postage for invoices; urging further trade-mark legislation to complete the participation of the United States in the benefits of the International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property; favoring the granting of further power to the interstate commerce commission to enforce its decisions, and favoring the inspection of grain by a national bureau.

Reciprocity with Canada is asked by commercial organizations in Boston, Cincinnati and Pittsburg, Philadelphia, Scranton and Baltimore present resolutions favoring one-cent postage.

Other subjects of discussion will be improvement of rivers, harbors and inland navigation, projects for navigable waters from the Great Lakes to the Atlantic and the Gulf, Mississippi levee protection, free ship canal from Chesapeake Bay to the Delaware river, currency changes, consular reform, and the Panama canal.
