TRADE OF HAWAII

EXPORTS FOR 1903 AMOUNT.
ED TO \$26,000,000.

Natives Are Decreasing in Number and Whites Constantly Increasing — Breadstuffs the Principal Imports — All Exports Came to the United States.

Washington, Jan. 18.—Some interesting facts about present conditions in Hawaii are presented by the department of commerce and labor through its bureau of statistics. These facts reached that bureau in the Hawaiian annual for 1903, which arrived on the opening day of the new year.

Regarding the population, the figures show a steady decrease in the number of natives and a steady increase in the number of persons of foreign birth, especially Japanese and Chinese.

In 1872 the number of natives was, in round terms, 50,000, and in 1900, 30,000.

In 1872 the number of Chinese was, in round terms, 2000, and in 1900, 25,000. The record of Japanese among the population only begins in 1884, when the number was 116 persons, but in 1900 the number was over 61,000. The total population of 1872 is given at 56,879, and in 1900 at 154,000.

The relation of nationality to plantation labor is indicated by a table which shows the nationality and number of sugar plantation laborers, the number of Japanese being 31,023, out of a total of all nationalities of 42,212, these figures being for the year 1902.

The Japanese plantation laborers increased from 13,884 in 1894 to 31,204 in 1902; while the Chinese laborers on sugar plantations fell in number from 8114 in 1897 to 3883 in 1902. Portuguese are next in rank in the number of sugar plantation laborers, the number of Portuguese being 2689, while native Hawaiians are only 1348 in number; and of Porto Ricans, 2032.

The commerce of the Hawaiian islands for 1903 is given at \$26,000,000, of exports, and \$14,000,000 of imports. Of the imports, over \$10,000,000 is stated as from the United States, \$500,000 from Great Britain, \$750,000 from British colonies, and \$1,000,000 from Japan.

Of the exports, practically all are to the United States. The larger items of imports are breadstuffs, nearly a million and a half dollars in value; cotton manufacturers, about \$1,000,000 in value; iron and steel manufacturers also about \$1,000,000 in round terms; mineral oils, over a half million; provisions, about a half million dollars; tobacco, \$500,000; lumber, \$500,000, and wines, malt

OREGON WILL LEAD

EASTERN EDITOR PRAISES GREAT RESOURCES HERE.

Says the State Must Lead the World in the Production of Lambs—Open Ranges and Enormous Succulent Crops Make it the Ideal Stock Region of the United States.

"Eastern stockmen are greatly impressed with the splendid opportunity Oregon has to excel all other sections of the country in the production of purebred stock," said A. C. Halliwell, editor and publisher of the Chicago Daily Livestock World, while in Portland attending the livestock convention.

"I have seen the flocks and herds of England and Scotland and do not hesitate to say that the climate and soils of Oregon are capable of producing purebred animals that are equal to the best that are grown in bonnie Scotland or merry England.

"It is a well known fact that a large share of the first prize winning lambs at American fairs and stock shows are imported from England. The reason for this is that owing to the mildness and moisture of the English climate lambs that are dropped no earlier than in our eastern and central portions of the country make a better growth than is possible with us.

"Now, all that can be said in favor of the English climate for producing fine lambs holds good in larger measure with regard to the Oregon climate.

"Instead of our American exhibitors being compelled in the future to import prize-winning lambs or see the prizes go to foreign exhibitors, they will be able to get earlier and

Arab Customs.

Among the Arabs an interesting department of woman's duty is dairy work. This, like all other operations, is carried out on an old-fashioned patriarchal plan. To make butter, for instance, a small sheepskin is filled with milk and tied to a ring in the wall. The woman then sits flat on the floor and rocks it to and fro till the little balls of butter begin to form within.

These grow larger and larger and accumulate and are finally brought out as one big lump. The remaining milk is then boiled on the fire with bits of meat. The male members of the family now come together, a large dish of cooked rice is placed before them and the boiled milk poured over it. Then, making balls of the mixture with his hands each member quickly swallows his share and rises to wash his hands. This done, the girls and mother sit down and eat what the men are pleased to leave.
