WORK AT THE DALLES

THERE IS NOW \$400,000 AVAILABLE FOR CANAL

Government Engineers Think Work On Canal Will Begin as Soon as Right of Way is Secured-State Board Will Surely Get Right of Way Early with Funds at Hand.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 26. — It has been definitely decided that there will be no river and harbor bill passed at this session of congress. However the canal and locks at The Philos were provided for in the Sun. However the canal and locks at The Dalies were provided for in the Sundry Civil appropriation bill which provided \$100,000 for work at The Dalles, and there is an unexpended balance left over from last year of \$200,000, making a total of \$400,000 available for work on the locks and canal during the year 1904 canal during the year 1904.

The government engineers say this is more than will be used at The Dalles before congress meets again, and that the failure of the river and harbor bills to pass at this session is really no delay to the canal and locks.

The state will secure the right of way free of charge to the govern-ment with \$100,000 appropriated at the special session of the legislature and the government will be at no preliminary expenses, out can apply the funds at hand to actual construc-tion work on the ship canal

It is the opinion of the engineers of the war department that work will commence on the canal as soon as the title to the right of way for the entire route can be secured by the state. This is now the only obstacle in the way and the state board has expressed the belief that it will encounter no serious difficulty In securing right of way with the funds at hand.

EPISCOPAL BISHOP

REV. DR. DAVID GREER WILL BE ORDAINED TODAY.

Consecration Takes Place In New York-The New Bishop is 60 Years of Age, and a Man of Unusual and Recognized Ability-Has Been Offered a Bishopric Twice Before, But Refused

New York, Jan 26. - Surrounded by the bishops of the Protestant Episcopal church, accompanied by a host of clergy and amid the most elaborate ceremonial, the Rev. Dr. David H. Greer was consecrated as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of New York. The ceremony was in St. Bartholomew's church, of which Dr. Greer is rector.

It was a little after 10 o'clock when the bishop, led by Bishop Potter of New York, left the parish house and proceeded across the small inclosure to the church. The bishop-elect was escorted by his presbyters, the Rev. Drs. Morgan Dix and W. R. Huntington, and behind him came the visiting clergy, and then the surpliced choir of the church, singing a processional. By and then the surpliced choir or the church, singing a processional. By the time the head of the procession entered Bartholomew's the pews had been filled by members of the parish and visitors.

The ceremony began with the reading of the prayer of the morning. Then came a sermon by Bishop Doane of Albany. The ceremony of consecration followed, according to the ritual of the church. The consecrators were Bishop Potter. Bishop Doane and Bishop Dudley of

Kentucky.
The Rt. Rev. David Hummell Greer The Rt. Rev. David Hummell Greer was born in Wheeling, W. Va., in 1844. He received his education at Washington College, Philadelphia, and the Protestant Episcopal Seminary in Gamhier, Ohlo, He received the degree of Doctor of Divinity from Kenyon College and Brown University. In 1866 he was ordained, His first pastorate was at Clarksburg, W. Va., where, although it was only a small country place, Dr. Greer achieved such prominence that he received a call to a charge that he received a call to a charge in Covington. Ky... Then he went to Grace church. Providence. There he established his reputation as a preacher and organizer, and when, in 1888, the pulpit of the church of St. Bartholomes in this charge hear. Bartholomew in this city became va-cant he was asked to accept the rectorate. In 1897 Dr. Greer was elected bishop coadjutor of Rhode Island. He declined to accept the office. Four years later he was also elected bishop of the diocese of
