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The city of Pendleton is in debt today over \$200,000, di-vided as follows: General bonds, \$75,000; Levee bonds, \$40,000; water bonds, \$45,000; sewer bonds, \$30,000 and a floating warrant indebtedness of over \$10,000. The parti-san administration, which has just taken charge of the af-fairs of the city, instead of conducting the business of the city on economical lines to get out of debt, has raised the salary of the city recorder \$25, per month, making an increase of \$300 per year, created the useless office of sewer inspector, at a salary of \$40 per month, or \$480 per year, and today gave the city advertising to the highest bidder the Morning Tribune, which bid 6 cents per inch, against 5 cents an inch bid by the East Oregonian. One of the councilmen before going into office announced that no democrat would be allowed to hold office as long as he was in the council, and two more of them signed a resolution as coun-cilmen, asking that the Morn-ing Tribune be made city official paper, without soliciting ing bids, to get work done as cheaply as possible, for the city.
