TAUGHT FIFTY YEARS,

lowa Educator Been in the Harness

Half a Century, Cedar Falis, Ia., Jan. 29. — Fifty consecutive years as a teacher is the record achieved by Prof. M. W. Bartlett, of the Iowa state normal school, and today faculty, students and alumni of the school united in paying tribute to the venerable educator in celebration of his golden jubilee. The greater part of the day was set aside for the celebration and addresses were delivered by prominent educators and others. The address of the day was delivered by President Thomas McClelland, of Knox College, who was a pupil of Prof. Bartlett nearly a half century

Prof. Bartlett was born in New Hampshire in 1834. He was graduated from Dartmouth college, and for a time taught in the country schools near his home. He came to lowa in 1857 and became an instruc-tor in Western College. For a few years he was president of the insti-tution. From Western College he went to Denmark Academy, and later spent three years in a private school in Missouri. In 1876 Prof. Bartlett accepted a position on the first faculty of the lowa state normal school and has been with the insti-tution ever since. For many years he had charge of the department of mathematics, but recently he has been instructor of English.
