SCHOOL EXHIBITS

TIME LIMIT EXPIRES MONDAY FEBRUARY 8.

Several Exhibits are Complete and Have Arrived - Pendleton Exhibit is Not Finished, and Some Others Not Ready, Who Are Preparing Collections—Get Ready for St. Louis.

The exhibits which have been prepared for the St. Louis Fair by the different schools of the county are beginning to come into the office of the county superintendent, and will be shipped by him to the committees having the matter in hand in Portland.

Adams, Ferndale, Athena, Milton and McKay now have their exhibits ready, and all are in the city with the exception with the one from Milton, which will be shipped by the school direct to the committee in Portland.

Pendleton is not yet ready, but is working hard and will ship direct to Portland, and Weston, Pilot Rock and Helix will have their material together by the latter part of the week and ready for shipment.

The time limit set by the department for the presentation of the exhibits expired February 1, but owing to various causes which delayed the schools that have not yet submitted their exhibits, the county superintendent has extended the time for one week, and on next Monday will ship all of the material sent him to the people in Portland, who will arrange the state exhibit and take it to the fair at St. Louis.

CONVENTION PRELIMINARIES.

Arranging for Democratic Convention at St. Louis.

St. Louis, Feb. 2.—The committee on arrangements appointed by Chairman James K. Jones, of the democratic national committee, held its first meeting at the Southern hotel today to consider preliminary plans for the reception and accommodation of the delegates and visitors to the democratic national convention here in July.

The members of the committee, nearly all of whom were present, are John E. Osborne of Wyoming, J. M. Head of Tennessee, John R. McLean of Ohio, J. G. Johnson of Kansas, Norman E. Mack of New York, D. J. Campau of Michigan, J. N. Guffey of Pennsylvania and William J. Stone of Missouri. The committee inspected the Coliseum, where the convention is to be held, and also investigated the hotel facilities.

A conference was held with a delegation representing the St. Louis entertainment committee and a number of minor details discussed. Other work coming within the scope of the committee will be transacted at a meeting to be held later.

O. R. & N. IMPROVEMENTS.

Channel of Burnt River Changed to Remove Two Bridges.

F. J. Walsh, civil engineer on the O. R. & N., was in the city yesterday at work near Weatherby during the past few months, where the channel of Burnt river was changed by cutting through the point of bill for about 200 feet.

By making this deep cut for a new channel, two long bridges across the river have been done away with and the roadbed improved by building substantial grade where the old channel of the river crossed the track.

An immense amount of work was done on the Burnt river canyon last season by the O. R. & N. New steel bridges have been built and the roadbed improved at every possible point. It is quite probable that some track will be graveled in the canyon this season, although it is not definitely known yet.
