"Often the sons of rich men are placed in the big houses to "learn the business.' Salaries range from \$35 to \$40 a month. Many of these young fellows have no qualifications other than that they are rich men's sons. That these rich chaps should fill positions to the exclusion of men with families, needs correction.

"Ability, stability, clean living, energy, should be the qualifications; yet daily young men fully up to these requirements meet with disappointment because some young man to whom money is not the object is willing to work for low wages.

"Then, there is the disgraceful practice of hiring women at half price to do man's work. Can a girl live on \$3 or \$4 a week simply because she works for that sum? Some men try to justify this species of white slavery. No business is successful that gets profits by under

"We have severe laws against Chinese cheap labor, but how about white American girls in Spokane, working for a sum that will not pay care fare and room rent? The American girl is self-reliant, bright, adaptable and intelligent. In business she is to be trusted beyond men.


