Mount Whitney military reservation in California, has been added to the Sequoia National Park, and abandoned for military purposes.

Fifteen hundred non-union coal miners employed by the Ellsworth (Pa.) Coal Company, have gone on strike against an announced cut in wages.

Lee DeFord is accused of embezzling \$21,000 of the funds of the Altamont, Mo. bank. He has been captured while in hiding at Gallatin, Mo.

Within the past week the Uruguay rebels have made great advances and are now encamped in formidable force only 12 miles from Montevideo, the capital.

The government of Colombia has brought suit in the French courts to enjoin the Panama Canal Company from receiving any of the money the United States proposes to pay it for canal rights and improvements.

Miss N. E. Sumner, cashier of a Michigan avenue, Chicago, restaurant, refused to "shell out" when armed hold-up men demanded her cash and had to be beaten into helplessness before they could rob the till. They got \$90.

OPPOSE EIGHT HOUR BILL. Expected That the Present Congress Will Turn it Down.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 4. - Organized labor is vitally interested in the Eight-hour Labor bill, which came up for hearing today before the House Committee on Labor, and is fighting heroically on behalf of the measure, but from all appearances there is little hope that the bill will meet any better fate than the similar measure defeated at the last session of congress.

The present measure is designated to prohibit work on any government contract from being prosecuted more than eight hours a day, even in the shops of sub-contractors. The National Building Trades association, which was formed at Chicago last fall, is prosecuting a vigorous fight against the bill and also against Grosvenor's "Anti-Injunction" or "Anti-Conspiracy" bill now pending before the House Committee on Judiciary.

REMARKABLE ADVANCE. Enormous Increase in Seattle Real Estate Values.

Seattle, Feb. 3. - The lot at the southeast corner of Second avenue and Madison street was sold yesterday to the American Savings Bank and Truete company for \$160,000, or \$2,666 a front foot. The sale of the property, 60x120 feet in size, at that price shows the remarkable manner in which real estate valuations are maintaining themselves in this city. Samuel Fraunthal, the former owner, bought the property in 1887 for \$900.

The new owners of the property, who include Butte and San Francisco capitalists, as well as local business men, will immediately prepare plans for a six story steel office building to be erected on the site to cost more than \$1,000,000.
