FOR NEW MANAGER

DR. VINCENT MAY BE TENDERED IMPORTANT POSITION.

Northwestern Gas & Electric Company Will Possibly Purchase Boise City Plant and Railway—A General Manager Will Be Selected for the Entire System of Plants, Including Boise, Pendleton and Walla Walla.

A Boise City paper gives the following outline of the plans of the Northwestern Gas & Electric Company, to which the Pendleton light plant belongs:
"It is rumored that the Northwestern Gas and Electric Company at Walla Walla, Wash., and at Pendleton, Or., will purchase the Boise City electric railway and light plant, and consolidate the three plants, and install a monster power plant on the Little Walla Walla River, in Umatilla county, from which light and power will be distributed over a large territory. It is also understood that Dr. F. W. Vincent, formerly principal owner of the Pendleton plant, and at present a stockholder in the new company, and superintendent of the plant at Pendleton, will be tendered the position of general manager of the entire property of the Northwestern company, including the plants at Walla Walla, Pendleton, Boise and also the big power plant on the Walla Walla."
Dr. Vincent said today when seen by the East Oregonian, that the plans of the company had not reached such a point yet, and that the deal for the Boise plant and railway is entirely problematical and only in the first stages of investigation at this time.

The Pendleton and Walla Walla plants will be furnished with power and light from the monster plant to be built on the Little Walla Walla river. Papers covering the water rights of the company on the Little Walla Walla will probably be filed with the county recorder tomorrow.
As to the appointment of himself as general manager, Dr. Vincent said that no such offer had been made him at this time, but that a manager would be elected by the company when a time comes for such a move.

COUNTY COURT.

Will Consider License Matters and Election Boards.
The county court will meet tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock in adjourned session for the consideration of the liquor license asked for by A. B. Stevens, of Umatilla. This license should have been considered at the last session, but owing to a mistake in the notice it has to be re-advertised, and this is the earliest date upon which the court could take action.
Monday morning the court will meet to hear any objections which may be made to any of the judges or clerks of election who were appointed by the court at its last session. It might be that the judges and clerks for a precinct had been appointed all from one party, in the absence of accurate knowledge of their party affiliations, or persons may have moved out of the precinct unknown to the members of the court, and therefore the commissioners meet to revise the list and listen to any objections that may be offered.
