GENERAL NEWS.

Edna Barker and wife have been found murdered at Riverton, Neb. Barker's brother Frank, is under arrest.

General John C. Black, commander of the G. A. R., is seriously ill at Washington, D. C., principally from nervous collapse from overwork.

A 2 1/2-year-old baby boy fell out of a second-story window at Livingston, Mont., alighting upon a stone pavement, 14 feet below, and was absolutely unhurt.

Commercial bodies of San Francisco are trying to have pneumatic mail tubes introduced in that city to expedite collection and delivery of mail matter.

James Smith, a wealthy Brooklyn man, a church member and highly respected, has been detected hand-in-glove with a finely organized gang of coin counterfeiters.

The natural supply of platinum in the United States is decreasing very rapidly. Practically the only hope of a fresh supply is from recent undeveloped discoveries in Central and Southwestern Oregon.

Chief Two Feathers, of British Columbia, is looked upon as the coming world's champion wrestler. He lately threw the two white champions of Canada at one bout, with a short rest between clinches.

The First Methodist church of Spokane has 1,800 members, being the third largest membership of any Methodist Episcopal church in the United States. Its pastor for two and a half years past has been Dr. A. R. Lambert, leader of the anti-vice crusade.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

Theodore Adams, a son of well-to-do parents, is in jail at Butte, for a series of burglaries, extending over several months.

A skillful forger using the name of J. E. Bonnell, a prominent contractor, defrauded Tacoma business men out of \$200 Friday.

Legal action has been taken against several dairies in the heart of the residence district of Walla Walla. The unbearable odor is said to cause sickness.

An artificial lake in Lincoln Park, Tacoma, has been drained by the work of beavers, which have undermined the woodwork of the dam and permitted the water to escape.

H. W. Gardner, a prominent street car conductor of Tacoma, died Friday of blood poisoning, contracted by rubbing a brass railing on his car against a fever sore on his lip.

Mrs. Ellen Allen, of Seattle, who killed Mrs. Laura Graham last November in that city, for despoiling her home and alienating her husband's affections, was acquitted by the jury Friday.

James M. Walters, bellboy of the Colonial hotel, San Francisco, admits the theft of \$10,000 worth of diamonds from Baroness Radziwell, who was a guest of that hostelry a few weeks ago.

The city council of Ashland has passed an ordinance against the use of slot machines. Owners had been paying \$5 per month fines, but the new council has done away with the machines altogether.

The state board of agriculture will meet at Salem on Monday, February 8, to make preliminary arrangements for the state fair, to be held next September. Part of the speed program will be arranged at that time.

Alexander Morrissey, of Turtle River, Mont., narrowly escaped being torn to pieces by a pack of 15 wolves Friday. He slew several of them with an ax and made his escape from the remainder of the pack by climbing a small tree. Two hounds with him were killed and eaten by the hungry wolves.
