GENERAL NEWS.

A general strike of Erie railroad telegraphers is imminent.

The theatrical business is in bad shape, both in the cities and "on the road," everywhere east of the Rocky mountains.

Count Alexieff, "vice czar," in supreme command, civil and military, for Russia in the Far East, is 82 years of age.

Five tons of iron shoe pegs left San Francisco in one shipment a few days ago, consigned to Japan for the use of its army.

There is a great deal of real financial distress among the thousands of actors who have been out of employment in Chicago since the fire.

The liner China has just arrived at San Francisco with \$400,000 worth of opium, \$1,355,000 worth of raw silk, and Japanese gold yen worth \$1,075,000.

In the fire two Methodist ministers—George H. Studley and C. F. Roberts—lost their lives, as did also nearly 100 members of the Methodist church.

The Republic of Panama will have a regular army of 100 men. All its public functions will be purely those of a police force, but it is called "army" just the same.

The Peabody Insurance Company, of Baltimore, has failed on account of the great fire, and a receiver has been appointed. It had \$700,000 losses in that fire and \$300,000 with which to pay them.

Five and eleven-one hundredths inches of rain fell at Oakland, Cal., when the drought was broken, which was the greatest amount that has fallen at that point inside of 24 consecutive hours, since 1849.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

The state health board reports 15 cases of smallpox at Condon, in Gilliam county.

The high water in the Willamette has caused water to back up in cellars on the lower streets of Salem.

Fire destroyed the Montana Coal & Coke company's store at Horr, Mont., on Monday; loss about \$25,000.

Harry Brown, of Salem, has been sent to the asylum for trying to start another religious sect in that city, resembling the "Holy Rollers."

Fire in a Sixth street drug store at Portland, did \$30,000 worth of damage, on Monday. The fire was caused by electrical wires. The stock was fully insured.

W. M. Howarth and H. A. Johnson, street car conductors of Tacoma, are under arrest for embezzling company funds in fares. Their thievery has extended over a period of many months.

The license of the engineer on the wrecked steamer Clallam, has been permanently revoked by the board of investigation, and the captain has been taken out of service for a year for carelessness in the rescue of his passengers.

Matt Cullen and George Kelly, two of the thieves who stole \$5,000 worth of furs from the Silverfield fur parlors at Portland last Friday, are under arrest in Portland. They were caught in the act of disposing of a portion of the stolen goods.

Jonah Phillips, a miner of Seattle, has sued the Snoqualmie Light & Power Company for \$21,000 damages for injuries received from a live wire which had fallen across the county road near Benton. Phillips was horribly burned, while traveling the road in the darkness.

They then use this list to excite people who are anxious to invest in a "good thing" and sell territory at high prices on the strength of the sales made by these experts.
