AMONG THE EXCHANGES OF THE INLAND EMPIRE

Boise is Rejoicing.

This city paid the Oregon Short Line over \$800,000 last year for freights according to figures given out by the company, and certainly a large sum was realized as passenger receipts. The freight and passenger business transacted here by the company makes Boise the second town on the line. Salt Lake is first and Pocatello third.

The importance of Boise as a revenue producer is not being overlooked by the company. Rates from eastern and Missouri river points have been voluntarily lowered so that Boise wholesale dealers are now placed on an equality with Salt Lake.

A force of men will begin taking up the 60-pound rails in a few days west of Granger. In order to replace them with 80-pound rails. The 60-pound rails will be put in on the Boise branch to take the place of the 45-pound rails now in use.

Wallowa Wants an Outlet. We have received the petition of Mr. W. W. Burns, of Grouse, Oregon, which the citizens of that district sent to our board of commissioners for opening a wagon road across the Blue mountains.

It shows the advantages to this country and Pomeroy business for the 1,500 people to have access to our country. If our finances will permit it our board is perfectly willing to do what they can to give that people an outlet if there were no

advantages to be derived directly from it. Most of them live in this county and have a right to ask assistance for this road.

Asotin county has given \$2,000 to make a road to Asotin and the business men of that place. Lewiston and Clarkston have given another \$1,000 to supplement that of Asotin county. We hope they may get both outlets soon and be able to trade at any point they desire, but it seems to us that local capital will supply their needs of most things at home when the roads are in such condition as to haul goods in over there.—Pomeroy Independent.

Rural Delivery in Baker County.

The farmers in the vicinity of Haines, Rock Creek and Muddy Creek will undoubtedly be served with free delivery of mail after April 1.

A special postal inspector is expected to arrive in a few days and look over the situation and establish the route.

About 100 farmers will be served, within a radius of about 25 miles, and will be greatly appreciated by the patrons of the route, as it will not be necessary for them to come to town to procure letters. The farmers will provide a box at their gates in which their mail is to be deposited. These boxes applied at the patrons' expense, the kind in general use having a lock and a red flag attached. When the carrier places the mail in the box he places this 'little flag in an upright position on top of the box, as a signal that there is some mail therein. Farmers living off the route may be served by placing a box at a convenient point on the route, in which they may receive their mail and letters.—Haines Record.

Has the Baseball Fever.

Walla Walla promises to be in demand this spring as training quarters for Pacific National league teams. Spokane is figuring on coming here, and McCloskey wants to bring Boise here. The Spokane team wants to put in about three weeks preliminary training.—Walla Walla Union.

CONDENSED INFORMATION ON THE WAR

Tokio, Feb. 16.—In condensed form the reader is presented with some information concerning Japan and Russia in the far east which at this time should prove not only interesting but instructive as bearing on the events transpiring across the Pacific.

RUSSIAN TROOPS IN THE FAR EAST.

First Siberian Army Corps. Southern Manchuria—Twenty-one battalions of infantry of 400 men each, nine squadrons of cavalry and 34 guns. Vladivostok and Port Arthur—Two battalions of infantry; frontier guards, 26 battalions; 25 squadrons, 28 guns. Pe-che-li—Twelve battalions, 5 squadrons, 44 guns. Semitreichensk—Eight battalions, 22 squadrons, 28 guns. Uza—Four squadrons, four guns.

Second Siberian Army Corps.

Tsitsikar—Twelve battalions, 24 squadrons, 22 guns. Kirin—Twenty-six battalions, 25 squadrons, 102 guns. Detached posts—Twenty-one battalions, 46 guns.

Principal Railway Lines Available.

Fusan to Taiku; Chempulpo to Seoul, Korea. Vladivostok to Port Arthur; Vladivostok to Kharbin; Kharbin to Mukden and Port Arthur, China. In Japan all the important cities and towns are connected by rail-ways.

Important Distances.

Nagasaki, Japan to Port Arthur, China, 585 miles. Japan to Korea, 200 miles. Vladivostok to Port Arthur, 1,200 miles. Port Arthur to Moscow, 5,000 miles.

Japan's Naval Bases.

Yokosuka—Arsenal, slip and drydock. Kure—Arsenal, slip, drydock and armor plate works. Sasebo—Arsenal. Maizuru—Dockyard. Nagasaki—Three docks. Kobe—Torpedo repair yards. Matsouai—Refitting yards. Ominato—Accommodation for small craft. Tokashika—Dockyard. Raushima—Dock and coal supply.

Russia's Naval Bases in the Far East.

Vladivostok—Harbor and arsenal, drydock, floating dock and coal supply. Harbor is now icebound. Dalny—Harbor and refitting yard and coal supply. Port Arthur—Tidal basin, drydock, refitting yard and coal supply.

Coaling Stations.

Japan—Yokosuka, Kure, Maizuru, Nagasaki, Tokashika, Matsouai, Kobe, Ominato. Russia—Dalny, Port Arthur, Vladivostok.

Naval Forces in the Far East.

Japan—Battleships 6, armored cruisers 22, protected cruisers 14, torpedo boats 73, destroyers 9. Russia—Battleships 8, armored cruisers 5, protected cruisers 8, torpedo boats 20, destroyers 12.

Largest Battleships of Each Nation in the East.

Japan—Mikasa, built 1900; 15,000 tons displacement; main battery, four 12-inch guns; crew 935; speed 18 knots an hour. Russia—Caarevitch, built 1901; 13,100 tons displacement; main battery, four 12-inch guns; crew 732; speed 18 knots an hour.

Armament of the Japanese Army.

Infantry—Midi magazine rifle, five shot. Depot Troops—Murata magazine rifle, eight shot. Cavalry—Sword and carbine. Artillery—Field and mountain batteries, 12-pounder Ariska.

Armament of the Russian Army.

Infantry—Three-line magazine rifle, five shot. Cavalry—Sword, rifle bayonet and lance. Artillery—Three-inch quick-fire 15-pounders, 28-pounders and six-inch howitzers.

Japanese Powder Factories.

Uji, Itabashi and Iwahawa. Arsenals at Tokyo and Osaka. Gun Power on Principal Ships.

Japan—Battleships, 12-inch guns, 28; battleships, six-inch guns, 68; cruisers, eight-inch guns, 24; cruisers, six-inch guns, 80. Russia—Battleships, 12-inch guns, 20; battleships, six-inch guns, 84; cruisers, eight-inch guns, 14; cruisers, six-inch guns, 56.
