CLEVELAND'S VIEWS

BELIEVES DEMOCRACY CAN ELECT A PRESIDENT.

Unusual Optimism for a Pessimistic Politician — Arraigns the Opposition for Extravagant Philippine Policy — Strong Leadership is the Hope of His Party.

The Saturday Evening Post of this week contains an able article from ex-President Cleveland on the need of union and organization among democrats.

Mr. Cleveland's optimism is of an unusual order for him. He says:

"I am one of those," he writes, "who believes that there is an opportunity for democratic success in coming presidential election."

"Though attachment for the party in which I am enlisted and an intense desire for its ascendancy makes such a belief exceedingly welcome, they certainly do not create it. It is built upon an unshaken and abiding trust in the patriotism and intelligence of my fellow countrymen."

"This is no time for cunning finesse nor for the use of words that conceal intentions or carry a double meaning. The democratic party has a message to send to its followers and to the masses of the American people. Let that message be expressed in language easily understood, unconfused by evasion and untouched by the taint of juggling. Obsolete issues and questions no longer challenging public interest should be manfully abandoned."

Mr. Cleveland urges tariff reform, pleads for economy in the expenditure of public money and charges the opposition with having made promises and broken them. He arraigns the administration's Philippine policy. Mr. Cleveland concludes as follows:

"At such a time as this the democratic party cannot with honor undertake the battle of the people except under a leader that not only represents its best traditions and purposes, but fully realizes what is meant by the tremendous issue of the conflict; and his selection should not depend upon so small a consideration as the locality whence he comes."

"The democracy's opportunity is already in sight, but only in a campaign waged in reliance on the people's love of country and devotion and national morality, under leadership that personifies the sentiments, would be found democracy's hope."

New Rate Schedule.

The local office of the O. R. & N. has received the schedule of rates for the World's Fair tickets during the St. Louis exposition. The round trip from Pendleton to St. Louis and return will be \$60; to Chicago and return will cost \$65.

On the round trip tickets to St. Louis and return by way of Chicago, no coupons will be sold, and the cost will be \$62.50.

There is a 10-day limit on the going time or on the first end of the trip, which will give approximately a five-day layover at any point desired by the tourist, as the traveling time from here to St. Louis is about five days. The time limit on the ticket is 90 days, and on the last lap the traveler can use the full time in stopover privileges.

Tickets will be placed on sale in the Pendleton office during three days in the months of May, June, July, August and September each, though the exact days of the sale have not yet been decided.

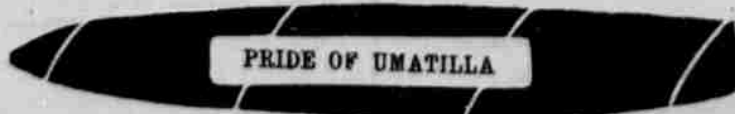
