Early Shearing is Becoming Popular for Several Reasons-Especially Advisable on Account of the Vigor and Better Health Transmitted to the Spring Lambs-Greatest Responsibility is That of Affording Sufficient Good Shelter.

The first of the wool harvest is in sight, and in a short time the clip will be coming into the warehouses.

Charles Cunningham has begun to shear his sheep, and has already fin-ished a flock of 3,000 blooded Merino bucks near his Pilot Rock ranch. He is now at work on the ewes, and will shear all, or nearly all of them

at this time Mr. Cunningham has followed the custom for several years of shearing most of his sheep at this time of the The fleeces on the bucks are now beginning to be heavy for them to carry, and the wool is getting so that the sheep begin to have trouble to see. It has been found that the sheep do better if relieved of the load of fleece and especially is this true in the case of the bucks, which are strong and well able to stand the loss of their wool this early in the year.
