REVIVAL CLOSED

ONE HUNDRED FORTY-THREE ADDITIONS TO CHURCH.

Seven Weeks' Campaign Just Closed
One of the Most Successful in History of Church in Eastern Oregon
—Over \$1,400 Pledged on Debt Last Night and \$200 Yesterday—
Rev. Martin Goes East to Waiting Appointments.

Rev. S. M. Martin closed a several weeks' revival at the Christian church with the largest crowd ever assembled in a Pendleton church last night. The Sunday school room, auditorium and gallery were filled to overflowing and all the standing room was taken, many remaining standing during the entire evening, in order to hear the magnificent sermon on "Apostasy."

This was one of the ablest sermons ever preached in the city, the climax describing the death of Julian, the world's greatest apostate, being especially dramatic and thrilling.

There were 35 additions to the church last night and yesterday, 31 by confession and four by affiliation.

At the meeting last night \$1,417.50 was pledged on the remaining church debt, which is now about cancelled, with the amount raised last night and about \$200 yesterday.

During the seven weeks' revival there have been a total of 143 additions to the church, the membership having been more than doubled. The committee and the pastor, N. H. Brooks, having the different phases of the meeting in charge, have been especially active and the campaign has been one of the most successful in the history of the church in Eastern Oregon.

Many Athena people were present last night to witness the close of the meeting, and it was a fitting climax for the energetic work done during the revival.

Rev. Martin left this morning for Sioux City, Iowa, from there he goes to Cedar Rapids, Enid, Oklahoma; Buffalo, Des Moines, and then jumps back to Salem, in this state, about one year from this month and last night promised to stop off and preach in this city one night, if possible, on his way to Salem, on his return trip.

He has remained in Pendleton several days longer than anticipated, owing to the increasing success of the meetings, and is now overdue at his next appointment.

Rev. N. H. Brooks will preach tonight, and a baptismal service will be held, at which about 35 converts will be baptized. It will be the largest number ever baptized at one time by the Christian church in this city.
