## ON THE STATE BOARD

### MAYOR W. F. MATLOCK ON AGRICULTURAL COMMISSION.

Appointed by Governor Chamberlain to Fill Vacancy Caused by Expiration of George Chandler's Term—Mr. Matlock Served Two Terms on the Board Before and Has Long Been a Life Member—Other Members.

Mayor W. F. Matlock this morning received his commission as a member of the state agricultural board of Oregon, having been appointed by Governor Chamberlain to fill the vacancy caused by the expiration of the term of George Chandler of Baker county.

Mr. Matlock's term begins on March 14, and expires in 1908, and while he has not been actively connected with the board for a number of years, Mr. Matlock served two terms on the board, having been appointed by Governor Pennoyer, and holds an honorary life membership on the board, having been elected to such, on his retirement from active service.

The people of Eastern Oregon will rejoice to know that Mr. Chandler has been succeeded on the board by such a practical and experienced man as Mr. Matlock, and the choice of Governor Chamberlain is universally commended.

While Mr. Matlock was an active member of the board before, he was one of a special commission of three, to collect and manage the Oregon exhibit at the Chicago World's fair, and made a record for the state which stands at the head of Pacific coast records in that line.

While Oregon, appropriated but \$60,000 for that fair, this commission collected an exhibit that took more premiums than any other Pacific coast state, and after paying all expenses, turned back into the state treasury, about one-third of the state appropriation.

Mr. Matlock has been interested in livestock and state fairs for more than a quarter of a century, and will enter the work of making a rattling good state fair program, with a ready knowledge of such things.

The other members of the board are C. A. Westgate, of Albany; Frank Lee, of Portland; W. H. Downing, of Salem; Jasper Wilkins, of Coburg, and Wylie A. Moores, of Salem, who is the secretary.

The board will hold a meeting in a short time, to elect a president to succeed Mr. Chandler, and Mr. Matlock, in speaking of the matter today, said, that he would favor a man for president who lives at the state capital, who could be in constant touch with the work.

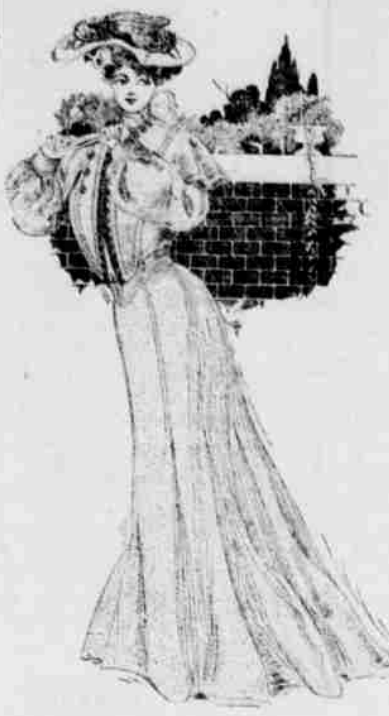

### LOST MANY SHEEP.

Frank Frazier Has But a Fraction Left of 2,600 Head.

Frank Frazier returned this morning from a trip to his sheep camp in Idaho, near Huntington.

He reports one of the hardest trips in the history of travel. The country has been flooded by rain for some time, and the Snake is on a rampage. The snow is melting and the ground is so soft that the sides are caving in along the cuts in the wagon roads, making travel almost impossible. Here and there along the roads can be seen freight wagons mired down in the mud, the freighters camped out by the side of their wagons, and their horses running loose along the mountain side.

Mr. Frazier found that a great many of his sheep had strayed off into the mountains and been lost, so that he has now but a fraction of the band of 2,600 sheep which he left there in the fall. The sheep went into the country in poor condition, and could not be held together.
