PROMOTIONS ARE RAPID.

O. R. & N. Firemen Have Been Made Engineers in Large Numbers.

The O. R. & N. has promoted over 20 firemen to the position of locomotive engineers at La Grande, within the past two years.

Some of these men had fired an engine less than three years, having begun their railroad careers as wipers or helpers in the round houses.

This is considered to be very rapid promotion, as many of the older engineers were compelled to serve as many as 10 to 13 years owing to the extreme dullness of business.

These young engineers are successful in every way, in all except rare instances, and their experience in being promoted in such a short time disproves the old idea that a man must be a fireman half a life time before being competent to run an engine.

The O. R. & N. has had an agreement with its firemen for years, providing that one fireman should be promoted to every old engineer hired, but owing to the shifting and migratory nature of so many of the old engineers that travel over the country, the company will recruit from the ranks of the firemen as far as possible.

The mountain division between Umatilla and Huntington is considered the most difficult division on the system and the young "runners" must pass a rigid air-brake examination, besides the regular mechanical and "book or rules" examination.

It requires about four hours of severe questioning to put a fireman through all the technical examination for the position of engineer, and some idea of the thoroughness of the examination may be gained by knowing that this entire time is consumed in a rapid fire of off-hand questions, which must be answered readily, without argument, and with full explanation on technical points where there is any doubt to the thorough knowledge of the student.

SHEARING WORLD'S FAIR SHEEP

Important Rule Announced by Chief of Live Stock Department of World's Fair.

A rule having an important bearing upon the shearing of sheep to be exhibited at the World's fair at St. Louis has been announced by Chief F. D. Coburn of the Department of Live Stock, as follows:

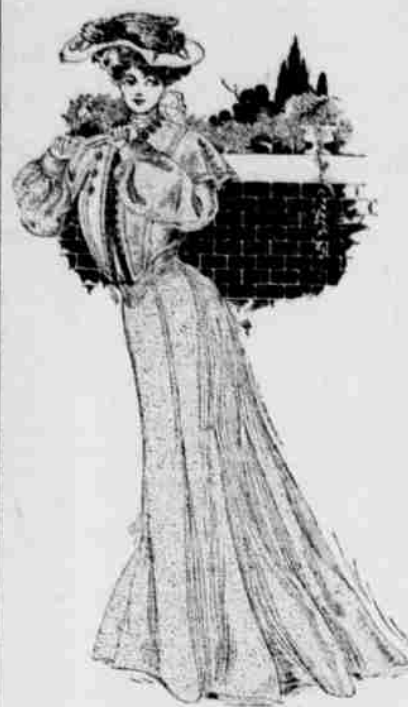
"All sheep and goats must have been evenly, closely and properly shorn on or after the first day of April, 1904, and the date of the shearing must be certified on the application for entry. Sheep or goats unevenly or stubble shorn or that have been clipped to conceal defects or to mislead will not be allowed to compete. The judge shall disqualify for competition any sheep or goat deemed by him as having been improperly or stubble shorn or with its fleece otherwise treated for purposes of fraud or deception."

The question of shearing in connection with the exhibition of sheep has been a vexed one at fairs and expositions for a long time.

Chief Coburn has gone into its details with a great deal of care and with the determination that the same high standard set elsewhere in the World's fair prize-list should prevail in this regard. A draft of a rule was sent to prominent breeders and authorities with the request for suggestions as to the best form.
