## GRANGE IS GROWING

SIX BRANCHES NOW WORKING IN EASTERN OREGON.

Membership of Over 300 in Union and Umatilla Counties—Recalls Farmers' Alliance Organization, Which Saved \$5,000 to Farmers in One Season by Purchasing Supplies by Wholesale.

The activity of the Grange in Eastern Oregon is one of the most important movements made in this district for 10 years. At this time there are six branches of this organization in Union and Umatilla counties, with a total of over 300 members.

The three branches in the Milton and Freewater districts have about 140 members and the three in Union county about 160. All of them are adding to their membership constantly, and are preparing the way for new organizations later in the season.

The organization calls to mind the Farmers' Alliance of the 90s, which was strong in both Umatilla and Union counties.

In Union county that organization saved to the farmers in one season, about \$5,000 by purchasing machinery and binding twine, of a local implement house, in wholesale. The farmers clubbed together and ordered a carload of supplies for harvest, and by this means, in several towns in the county, made a saving of this amount in one season.

So far, in this and Union counties, the Grange is in the social stage, and no business organization has been attempted yet, but it will gradually grow into a business organization, as it has in the Willamette valley, taking an active part in public affairs, and especially in county expenditures.

The preamble and general objects of the Grange are as follows:

#### PREAMBLE.

Profoundly impressed with the truth that the National Grange of the United States should definitely proclaim to the world its general objects, we hereby unanimously make this declaration of purposes of the Patrons of Husbandry.

#### GENERAL OBJECTS.

1. United by the strong and faithful tie of agriculture, we mutually resolve to labor for the good of our order, our country and mankind.

2. We heartily endorse the motto: "In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things charity."

3. We shall endeavor to advance our cause by laboring to accomplish the following objects:

To develop a better and higher manhood and womanhood among ourselves. To enhance the comforts and attractions of our homes, and strengthen our attachments to our pursuits. To foster mutual understanding and co-operation. To maintain inviolate our laws, and to emulate each other in labor, to hasten the good time coming. To reduce our expenses, both individual and corporate. To buy less and produce more. In order to make our farms self-sustaining. To diversify our crops, and crop no more than we can cultivate.

To condense the weight of our exports, selling less in the bushel and more on hoof and in fleece; less in lint, and more in warp and wool. To systematize our work, and calculate intelligently on probabilities. To discountenance the credit system, the mortgage system, the fashion system, and every other system tending to prodigality and bankruptcy.

We propose meeting together, talking together, working together, buying together, selling together, and, in general, acting together for our mutual protection and advancement, as occasion may require. We shall avoid litigation as much as possible by arbitration in the Grange. We shall constantly strive to secure entire harmony, good will, vital brotherhood among ourselves, and to make our order perpetual. We shall earnestly endeavor to suppress personal, local, sectional and national prejudices, all unhealthy rivalry, all selfish ambition. Faithful adherence to these principles will insure our mental, moral, social and material advancement.

#### TWENTY-TWO YEARS AGO.

Severest March in History of Umatilla County in 1882.

"March, 1882, was the worst March I ever saw in Umatilla county," said a prominent sheepman, in commenting on the favorable spring weather today.

"About 75 per cent of the lambs that had just been dropped were killed, out in the Pilot Rock neighborhood where I lived. A heavy snow, the first that came that winter, fell about March 10, that spring, just in time to catch the lamb crop. It had been a mild winter and while there was but little alfalfa raised in the county at that time, feed was plentiful and stock were in good condition.

"The McKay creek bottom was covered with rye grass, high enough to hide the hundreds of heads of cattle that ranged there during the winter, without hay.

"The snow that came in March and covered up the grass on the foothills and mountains and stock in those districts suffered terribly. Many calves, colts and poor stock died, while lambs were slaughtered by the wholesale.

"Over in Grand Ronde valley thousands of head of sheep froze to death and suffocated by piling up in heaps to keep warm. Hay sold over

there for as much as \$30 per ton and could not be had at that price. It was the roughest March I ever saw in Oregon."

#### FAMOUS STAGEDRIVER.

"The Wild Irishman" of Yellowstone Park, in Pendleton This Morning.

Jerry Mullen, one of the oldest stagedrivers now living on the Pacific coast, and familiarly known as "The Wild Irishman," was in the city this morning between trains, en route to Yellowstone Park, where he will enter the government employ once more.

He has been driving for the Elgin-Joseph Company through the Wallowa canyon, one of the most picturesque and dangerous pieces of stage road remaining in the West, for the past five months, and is now returning to his old position as driver in the Yellowstone Park.

Mullen hold the world's gold medal from the Columbian exposition, as champion driver of six and eight horses. He was one of 30 contestants at the Chicago World's fair, and received the highest award.

He carries his medal with him and treasures it dearly. He drove a short time for John Bailey through this city in 1879, and, having been absent from Pendleton since that time, would scarcely believe it to be the same village.

#### BRICK IS PLENTIFUL.

Weston Yards Are Not Furnishing Walla Walla and Will Begin Operation About April 1.

Clark Nelson, manager of the Weston brick yard, says the entire supply of the yard is now coming to Pendleton, for the new buildings contemplated here, and that not a contract is being filled in Walla Walla at this time.

He has sufficient brick in the yard to complete the Martin building, and the yard will begin the manufacture of the new brick about April 1, and it is not anticipated that any of the new buildings to be erected in this city will wait on Weston brick.

The supply for the Martin building is arriving at the rate of a carload per day, and by the time the old supply is all cleaned out, the new brick will be ready for the builders.
