GENERAL NEWS.

The Holden school building, Chicago, was burned yesterday. Loss, \$50,000. Six firemen were more or less injured.

Sacramento will at once spend \$80,000 improving and extending her levee system, to prevent damage by future inundations.

Pro-Russian Korean officials are feeling for their lives. Quite a number have escaped to Chee Foo on the American cruiser Cincinnati.

An association "to improve the breed of all classes of American horses" has been organized at Saratoga, N. Y. Its scope is intended to be national.

The 426 Filipino scouts at the Presidio are said to have drilling and maneuvering down to a finer and more accurate point than any regiment in the regular army.

All stories of extreme suffering of Russian soldiers on the Lake Balkal division are denied. It is claimed that not a man has been frozen to death since the war began.

It is stated by government dredgers and surveyors that every jetty placed in the delta of the Mississippi by Captain Eades is still in place and doing its work faithfully and accurately.

The country home of Rudolph Spreckles was burned near Sonoma, Cal. Loss, about \$95,000. It was vacant but for a watchman, who says he was awakened by a tremendous explosion.

The price of soft steel bars has been advanced \$1 per ton by the Eastern Bar Iron Association, which is another name for the American Steel Corporation when operating in certain side lines.

John M. Peters, of New York, an epileptic, last fall shot himself twice in the head with a pistol. One bullet was removed, the other was not. Peters is now in excellent health and entirely cured of the epilepsy.

John T. Spencer, of Grand Junction, Col., claims to have perfected a system by which seedless apples can be grown, of any variety. The discovery will effect as great a revolution in the apple industry as the growing of seedless oranges has in that direction.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

Mrs. Frances Hall, an aged woman of Portland, was gored almost to death Friday, by a bull. She is terribly lacerated and cannot recover.

Charles Vencke, a miner, was instantly killed at Stockton, Cal., Friday, by dropping 2,000 feet to the bottom of a shaft by the breaking of a cable latch.

Madge Miller, a woman of the tenderloin, said to be a Portland girl, whose true name was Aurora Tullerwell, killed herself in Salt Lake Friday, by shooting.

The three principal gas and electric companies of Seattle have consolidated under one management, and consumers fear a raise in the price of light and power.

Arthur C. Spencer, deputy district attorney of Multnomah county, has resigned and will accept a position in the office of W. W. Cotton, general attorney of the O. R. & N.

The fight that has begun in Sacramento against the unions dictating terms and employees to the contractors, threatens to spread to San Francisco, and another bitter strike is looked for.

The Butte labor unions have declared a boycott on a number of bartenders who refuse to join the local Bartenders' Union, and not a workman visits the saloons where these men work.

The wife of Rev. T. Downs, who eloped with Alvord, the Winlock blacksmith, deserting her five children, has consented to return home and accompanied her husband from Spokane to Winlock, Friday. Alvord is afraid of lynching, if he returns to Winlock.

AS TO NIGHT SHIFT

WOOLEN MILLS FORCE
MAY BE INCREASED.

Already Greater Than It Was Last Year, and the Mills May Be Operated at Night When the New Wool Crop Begins to Come In—Necessity for Such a Move is Not Easily Determined.

It is in the range of possibilities that the Pendleton Woolen Mills will start on night running about the first of May.

Since starting up after the shutdown of a short time ago, when the mill was overhauled and the machinery all put into the best of condition for a long and hard run, the work has been piling up until the management is having a hard time keeping orders filled as they become due.

Six additional girls have been put to work in the finishing room, and more could be used and undoubtedly will be put on in a short time. The finishing is being done in a different way this season than before. A great deal of fringing is being done, and the new help is employed chiefly in knotting the fringe, all of which has to be done by hand.

The volume of work is slowly overcoming the day force and it will be but a short time until it becomes absolutely necessary to start night running in order to keep abreast of the orders. The manager does not desire, however, to start such an innovation until he is fully prepared to carry out the plans.

In the first place, he has to be sure that the business will justify the move. The night shift would mean that just twice as much wool would be used, twice as much material in all departments, and at the same time the output would be doubled. It is, therefore, a question both of supply and demand, though the latter is of not so much moment as the former. C. J. Ferguson, the manager, does not wish to import a lot of operatives when if he would be able to give them but a part of the shift.

The indications are that there will be plenty of work to keep the mills running, so the principal delay is in the wool supply. There is enough on hand to run the mill until the new clip begins to come in, at the present rate of consumption, but no more. Night running cannot be started until new wool can be bought, which will not be before the first of May. When that time comes, it is pretty certain that the mills will be started with night shifts for the first time in several years.

PENDLETON INVENTION.

Messrs Whittinghill and Crank Make New Display Frame.

J. S. Whittinghill, manager, and W. A. Crank, salesman at the St. Joe Store, have invented and constructed a new device for the displaying of lace curtains, which has decided advantages over anything previously made for this purpose.

The new invention consists of an upright to which is attached revolving arms from which the curtains are hung. The rack will accommodate any number of curtains desired and all can be swung to view with ease, without disturbing the other curtains on the rack.

Messrs. Whittinghill and Crank have made provisions to protect their invention and have had photographs taken and specifications made preparatory to applying for a patent. The new idea is now in use at the St. Joe Store, where it can be seen.
