### DIVORCE CASE DISMISSED.

Parrish Family Are Denied the Freedom of Single Blessedness by Judge Ellis.

Judge W. R. Ellis has settled the divorce case of Della Parrish vs. Bruce Parrish for a time at least by dismissing it. This is the third divorce case that has been dismissed in this county for a number of years, and it is only in exceptional cases that the court will refuse to part the mated.

The court held that the defendant had done none of the things alleged by the plaintiff. He had not broken the rib of the plaintiff because the rib was broken before the marriage; he did not curse her except when both of them practiced up a little on their vocabulary. He provided for her as her station demanded, furnished medicine and doctors for her when she was sick, and was whiter than she was painted in general. The court also held that both of the parties were about a standoff in the matter of temper and therefore the court thought that he was not justified in separating them. He therefore dismissed the suit.

### HIGHEST WATER IN YEARS.

Butter Creek is Full to the Brim and Overflowing Onto the Idle Land.

Ralph Stanfield, who spent yesterday in the city, says there has been more water in Butter creek this year than ever before in his memory, and the snow has not yet begun to melt in the mountains.

At this time many of the Butter creek farmers, whose ditches are full and overflowing, are now turning the waste water onto the idle desert land and adjoining farms, to keep it from going to waste in the river below. It will benefit the farms to soak up the idle land near them, and this is now being done by many of the farmers whose ditches will not carry any more water.

The farmers in that vicinity look for a sufficient quantity of water to irrigate all the season from the prospects now. When the snow begins to melt in the mountains, the creek will not carry all the flood that is to come. If the government reservoir was now ready to receive the waste water, enough could be stored from Butter creeks' waste alone, to irrigate half the idle land in that vicinity.
