FOR BETTER FAIR

SPOKANE ALREADY MAKING GREAT PREPARATIONS.

School Exhibits Will Be Special Feature This Year—Sheep Dogs Will Be Seen in a Corraling Contest as at Salem State Fair in 1903—Will Imitate Scotch Entertainments.

Spokane, April 1.—R. H. Cosgrove, manager for the Interstate fair, plans for a new department for the fair this fall. It is practically decided that a school children's display will be among the leading features at the big fair, and that many valuable prizes will be offered as inducements for school children to put forth their best efforts.

Mr. Cosgrove held a conference this afternoon with Superintendent Tormey and the principals of the school. At this meeting he outlined the plan he proposed and it met with favor, and the principals appointed a special committee to take the matter up with Mr. Cosgrove. "The plan," said Mr. Cosgrove, "is to have the school children make exhibits of flowers they have grown themselves, of sewing, cooking, drawing, penmanship, woodwork, as well as other work. For each of these special lines prizes will be awarded. We also want the country schools to become interested in the fair and will offer special prizes for the students of schools outside of the city of Spokane. The local schools will not be pitted against the country schools, but separate prizes will be offered. This departure, while it is a new one, is, I believe, one that will be of much interest to the people."

Sheep Dogs in Field Trial.
Visitors at the Spokane Interstate fair this year will be given the opportunity of seeing a field trial of sheep dogs if the present plans of the kennel club are carried out. It is the intention to have a sheep driving contest such as is seen at the fairs in Scotland and such as was held last year at the Salem, Ore. fair. If the sheepmen can be interested sufficiently a silver cup will be offered and entries asked for.

SHEARERS' HEADQUARTERS.

Pendleton Will Outfit 200 Sheep Shearers This Spring.

Pendleton is the outfitting and starting point for nearly all the sheep shearers in Eastern Oregon. On account of the early season in the county, the shearers from Union and Baker counties come here to begin. They can get three weeks' work here and in Washington, before the shearing season arrives further east. These shearers come here singly and in crews, to scatter out to the various sheep districts. It is estimated that 200 shearers will outfit in this city this spring, to scatter to the shearing pens of Washington and Eastern Oregon.

These men make from \$5 to \$8 a day, according to the number of sheep they can shear, and are a jolly gang of boys. The crews consist of from 10 to 14 men, and each man buys from one to three pairs of new shears before beginning the season, which means about 300 pairs of shears sold in this city. The shearer's outfit consists of three pairs of shears, a new oil stone, a bottle of oil for the stones, leather for "bumpers," to rig up the shears so they will not click loudly, and a pair of new overalls.

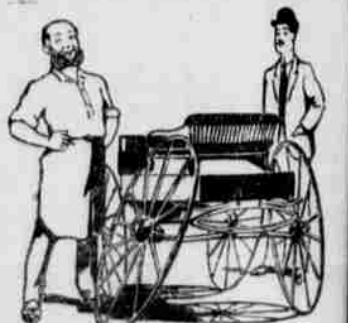
