8,000 WOOL SACKS

NEEDED TO HOLD THIS SEASON'S WOOL CLIP.

They Will Cost Nearly Three Thousand Dollars—The Greater Number Are Manufactured in Walla Walla and San Quentin Prisons, But Some Are From the East—They Will Contain the Product of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Sheep.

The warehousemen, and those who are dealers in supplies for the sheepmen, are beginning to figure up about how many bags the growers of the county will need for the coming season to hold the wool which they will put in the warehouses for sale.

It is estimated that there will be 250,000 sheep to be sheared in the county when shearing time comes, during the middle of this month, and the sheepmen calculate when ordering wool sacks that it will take three sacks for every 100 sheep. This would make it necessary for the sheepmen to have approximately 8,000 sacks in which to pack their wool this year.

These sacks will cost this season 35 cents each, which will make a total cost to the sheepmen of \$2,800 for sacks alone. Very few second-hand sacks are used, as they rot out from one season to the next, and when the wool is packed into them they rip and burst with the strain of handling. It is therefore the policy of the sheepmen to order new sacks for each season's clip.

A great many of the bags are made at the Walla Walla penitentiary when the jute mill at that place is running, and more at the San Quentin prison in California. A few of them come from the East, but the greater proportion is manufactured in the West.

MANGE IS PLENTIFUL.

Dr. Christie Says the State Veterinary Board Will Stamp it Out This Spring.

"It is true that mange is prevalent in all parts of Eastern Oregon this spring, among both horses and cattle," said Dr. J. Christie, member of the state veterinary board, to the East Oregonian, today.

"The state veterinary board will make an effort to stamp it out by persistently dipping and isolating the affected stock."

"There is a grave doubt in the minds of many so-called veterinarians as to whether cattle will take the mange from horses, but there is not the least question about the matter in the minds of scientific veterinarians."

THE TROUT LAW.

Limit of a Day's Catch Is 125, Over Five Inches in Length, and No Night Fishing.

The law regulating trout fishing has the following provisions:
Open season for fishing from April 1 to October 31; no night fishing, dynamiting, seining or fishing otherwise than with hook and line is allowed; all fish under five inches in length to be thrown back in the stream; the limit for one day is 125 fish.

The game and fish warden will take particular pains to enforce the laws regulating trout fishing as he has enforced those against killing deer and other game out of season. The state pays to propagate the trout in the streams and it is the duty of the official to protect the state's interest.

UMATILLA GIRL ABROAD.

Ta-Le-Ka-Pa-Mi Becomes Mrs. Bernard Sherry of Spokane.

Spokane, April 1.—Ta-Le-Ka-Pa-Mi is the name of a Umatilla Indian girl who was today licensed to marry a white man of Irish blood by the name of Bernard Domingo Sherry. When the girl's name is bunched and the hyphens are cut out, it means "Louisa" in United States, but she had Umatilla pride enough to insist that her name appear upon the official records in the original package.

R. W. Butler, the genial clerk who hands out from the auditor's office the papers which cut prominent figures in later divorce proceedings, is responsible for the spelling of the name, as the dusky damsel could only hand him "her mark" as a guarantee of good faith. Mr. Butler says the groom looked just as proud as grooms usually do and didn't seem to regard the name of his bride as a handicap to matrimonial bliss.

KEEPERS.

MONTANA SHEEP LOST.

Several Bands Scattered by Storm and Herders Die on Ranges.
Butte, April 1.—The story comes to Lewiston, Montana, that a rescue party has been out searching for three bands of sheep which were reported lost in the terrible storm of Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday in the Flatwillow country, two of the bands belonging to Nolan & Thompson and one to Ed Pirrie. The herders were also lost.

The search party found the body of Tom Haggerty, who was a herder for Nolan & Thompson, but the report is that the other herders have not yet been found. The greater part of the sheep have been rescued. Old-timers do not recall any such storm in the Flatwillow country. Ten or 12 inches of snow fell.
Stock conditions generally are not bad in Fergus county. The range is short and all stockmen are feeding, but cattle and sheep are generally in good condition.

NEW ATHLETIC CLUB.

Walla Walla Sports Will Form Association.
Walla Walla, April 1.—A plan is on foot by a number of local people of Walla Walla to organize a new athletic club. It is the plan to form a stock company and file articles of incorporation.

Those interested in the move have secured a building, which will be fitted up with the best athletic apparatus that can be purchased. A first-class instructor will be procured and it is the intention to make it a strong organization.

Corporations were organized in the Eastern states during the month of March with a total capitalization of \$83,000,000. This includes only those companies carrying a capital of \$1,000,000 or more each.
