the stems rot at the heart, and soon your alfalfa field will be barren.

"It is a mistake to believe that alfalfa needs so much water. It requires more sunshine and air, more cultivation and less flooding. Harrow the surface of your land, and hold the moisture at the roots of the alfalfa. For seed, you should grow alfalfa on the driest possible land. Seed from this flooded land would be useless. It would not be safe to sow it. It has no strength. It must be produced on dry soil, and hardened every year, to make it grow to perfection without a flood of water.

"The alfalfa grown under the diking system is small and weak and has no strength. It is watery feed, and has less substance than that grown with just a little surface irrigation and more cultivation. Alfalfa will grow anywhere the sand will not blow. The first crop should be cut and left on the ground to protect the roots.

"If you wish to prepare your ground in the highest possible efficiency for sugar beets, plow your alfalfa land in the fall and plant it to sugar beets the next spring.

"Wheat will not mature on this land, because it will grow too rank. The alfalfa straw is the best fertilizer that can be applied to soil, and the growing alfalfa crop also fertilizes the soil by drawing down the nitrogen into the roots and depositing it there for future uses.

"If you don't want your land to finally grow up to sand burrs and bull grass, quit flooding your alfalfa. Use your water more sparingly. Cultivate the ground more and soak it less."

At the conclusion of Mr. Bramwell's remarks a vote of thanks was tendered the speakers for their services in addressing the club, to the press for giving publicity to the meeting and especially to the O. R. & N. for furnishing the lecturers, whose instructive addresses had been of so much benefit and value to the club.

R. C. Judson, industrial agent of the O. R. & N., was the subject of several complimentary addresses by L. A. Estab, mayor of Echo, H. C. Willis, and other citizens who expressed their kindest feelings for the work he is doing for the farmers of the state.

It was decided that another meeting of the club would be held at Echo next Saturday, April 9, at which time "Dairying" will be the topic and an expert on dairying will be furnished by the O. R. & N. for an address before the club at that meeting.

GULF WHEAT SHIPMENTS.

Atlantic Seaports Outstripped by Southern Ports.

The interesting fact is brought out in the department of commerce bureau of statistics report for February, that only about 13,000 bushels of domestic wheat were shipped from the Atlantic coast ports of the United States during that month.

When it is mentioned that such ports as Portland, Me., Philadelphia, Boston and Newport News did not ship one bushel of American wheat abroad during that month, and that New York shipped only 12,904 bushels, some idea may be had of the extent to which wheat has sought new routes to Europe and the rest of the world.

The gulf ports of Galveston and New Orleans sent out 1,187,954 bushels, while the Pacific coast ports sent out 221,664 bushels. It may be noted with justice be claimed that this condition is to some extent an abnormal one, and that with transportation and price conditions improved

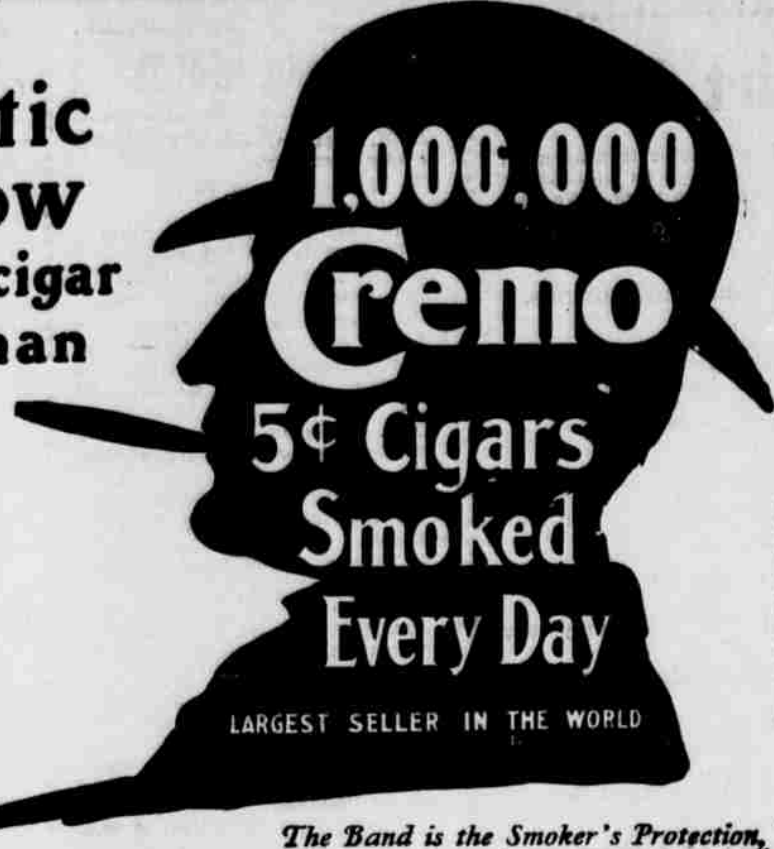

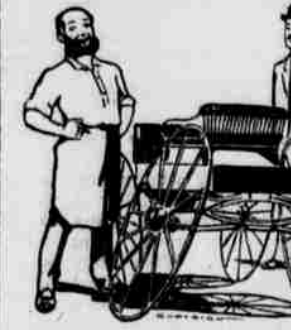
