## FARMERS' MEETING

the stems rot at the heart, and soon your alfalfa field will be barren.

"It is a mistake to believe that al-falfa needs so much water. It re-quires more sunshine and air, more cultivation and less flooding. Harrow the surface of your land, and hold the moisture at the roots of the hold the moisture at the roots of the alfalfa. For seed, you should grow alfalfa on the driest possible land. Seed from this flooded land would be useless. It would not be safe to sow it. It has no strength. It must be produced on dry soil, and hardened every year, to make it grow to perfection without a flood of water.

"The alfalfa grown under the dyking system is small and weak and

ing system is small and weak and has no strength. It is washy feed, and has less substance than that grown with just a little surface irrigation and more cultivation. Alfal-fa will grow anywhere the sand will not blow. The first crop should be cut and left on the ground to pro-

tect the roots.
"If you wish to prepare your ground in the highest possible efficiency for sugar beets, plow up your alfalfa land in the fall and plant it

to sugar beets the next spring, "Wheat will not mature on iand, because it will grow too rank. The alfalfa straw is the best fertilizer that can be applied to soil, and the growing alfalfa crop also fertilizes the soil by drawing down the nitrogen into the roots and depositing it there for future uses.

### GULF WHEAT SHIPMENTS.

Seaports Outstripped by Atlantic Southern Ports.

The interesting fact is brought out in the department of commerce bureau of statistics report for Febru-ary, that only about 13,000 bushels of domestic wheat were shipped from the Atlantic coast ports of the United States during that month.

When it is mentioned that such ports at Portland, Me., Philadelphia, Boston and Newport News did not ship one bushel of American wheat abroad during that month, and that New York shipped only 12,904 bushels, some idea may be had of the ex-tent to which wheat has sought new routes to Europe and the rest of the

To Improve Alabama River.

Tuskaloosa, Ala., April 4.—A well-attended convention met here today to discuss plans for the speedy com-pletion of the work of opening the Black Warrior and Tombigbee rivers and to prepare a memorial to con-gress asking that sufficient appro-priations for the purpose he includ-ed in the pending rivers and harbors bill. It is estimated that \$1,200,000 will be required to complete the waterway from the edge of the Bir-mingham coal fields to Mobile.
