MEMORIAL TO AID RUSSIA.

Special for Benefit of Red Cross.

April 4.—For the benefit of the suffering and wounded on the battlefields, Chicago society Mrs. Potter Palmer's res-

tended that the amount shall at once be forwarded to Russia. No political significance whatever is to be attached to the benefit, the organizer pointing out that Red Cross societies of both nations extend aid not only to their own wounded, but to the enemy's wounded as well, and the mere fact that this particular aid is to be sent to Russia does not mean that it is a formal expression of sympathy with the czar's government as against that of the mikado.
