Will Be Big Crop of Lambs. The past two or three days have been as nearly ideal spring weather as could be imagined, and shepherds are rejoicing over the prospects of a favorable lambing season.

FINE PROSPECTS ALL THROUGH WHEAT BELT. Everywhere the crop is thrifty and has excellent color, and the farmers are in excellent spirits.

A. L. Knight has just returned from a trip through the wheat belt, and is greatly encouraged by the outlook. At every place in the districts where the wheat is the main crop the farmers are glad with the prospects for a good crop.

The old wheat is still hanging at 66 cents, and there seems to be no disposition on the part of the market to make it better. It is possible that the price may be forced up a point or two before the new wheat begins to come in.

Nearly all last year's grain is out of the country. The grain companies bailed out all that they held before the first of last month in order that they would not have to stand for it being assessed. Practically all of the wheat is gone from the high line there is a lot of 40,000 in the warehouses at Warren station. This comprises nearly all of the wheat in the county that is not at this time sold.

Delegates From Five Southern States Are at New Orleans. New Orleans, La., April 6.—The most notable convention in support of the good roads movement ever held in the South began a two days' session in Tulane hall in this city today with a large number of good roads advocates and special delegations from all parts of Texas, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama and Louisiana.

The convention is being held under the joint direction of the National Good Roads Association and the New Orleans Progressive Union, and was called to order by W. H. Moore, president of the national organization. Cordial addresses of welcome were delivered by Governor Heard and Mayor Capdeville, who praised the object and work of the good roads movement.
