race and the second ballot resulted in 88 votes for Hudeman, 78 for Lloyd and 45 for Kilgore. Kilgore withdrew and the third ballot resulted in the choice of Mr. Lloyd by a vote of 102 against 97 for Mr. Hudeman.

Nomination for Sheriff.

T. G. Halley, in a neat speech, nominated T. D. Taylor for sheriff, who was made the unanimous choice of the convention.

For County Clerk.

When the nomination for county clerk was reached a buzz of interest and enthusiasm went through the convention. The name of J. S. Cherry was presented by J. T. Llewellyn, and T. J. Tweedy nominated W. D. Chamberlain, who made a neat and touching speech, declining the nomination and thanking the convention and the democrats of Umatilla county for having twice honored him with the office of county clerk. J. S. Cherry was declared the unanimous nominee for the office.

For Recorder.

Harry Fowler was nominated unanimously for the office of county recorder, there being no other name before the convention.

For Treasurer.

S. G. Lightfoot, of Vinson, was nominated for treasurer. Dr. Dell, of Weston, was nominated but withdrew from the race.

For Superintendent.

W. S. Mayberry was unanimously nominated for county school superintendent.

For Surveyor.

C. C. Berkeley, of Pendleton, was made the unanimous choice of the convention for county surveyor.

For Coroner.

Dr. Campbell, of Helix, was nominated for coroner, but declined, and Dr. T. M. Henderson was made the unanimous choice of the convention.

For Representatives.

W. D. Chamberlain and William Blakeley were chosen as candidates for the legislature without opposition.

For Assessor.

C. P. Strain was unanimously chosen as the candidate for county assessor. T. G. Halley in nominating Mr. Strain, said the people of Umatilla county believe that Mr. Strain has done his whole duty and that they will unanimously indorse the policy at the polls.

At the time of going to press the election of delegates to state and congressional conventions is in progress.
