### IRRIGATION WORKS.

Government Pushing Vast Works in Many Western States.

The progress of the irrigation work of the government is reviewed by the geological survey, which points out the necessity of great caution and conservatism in the extension of reclamation work.

It says that of the irrigation projects favorably reported in 1903, which included those on the Truckee river in Nevada, on the Salt river in Arizona, on the Milk river in Montana, on the Sweetwater river in Wyoming and on the Gunnison river in Colorado, the Nevada and Arizona projects have been found feasible and construction on the engineering works along the Truckee and Salt rivers has progressed reasonably.

The Montana project, however, presented unexpected difficulties. In Wyoming a better reservoir site than that on the Sweetwater, however, has been discovered on the North Platte, so that a large system of development may be worked out there. Engineering difficulties are encountered in the Colorado project. The amount of arid lands thereby reclaimable is less, too, than was anticipated.

The census bureau in a preliminary report on irrigation in New Mexico in 1902, shows 254,945 acres irrigated from all sources. The number of farms was 8,285, and the average cost per irrigated acre, \$16.87. The 1,246 irrigation systems cost, initially, for the main canals and ditches and the necessary seedgates, reservoirs, dams, pumping plants, etc., \$4,301,915. The entire length of main canals and ditches was 2,846 miles, an average length per system of over two miles.

### Congressman Hedge Renominated.

Keokuk, Iowa, April 14.—The republican convention of the First congressional district held here today resulted in the renomination of congressman Thomas Hedge. There was no opposition.

## CLOSE OF SCHOOLS RATIFY ON MAY DAY

PREPARATIONS FOR COMMENCEMENT WEEK.

Week's Program Will Be Opened by the Juniors—The Sunday Following the Baccalaureate Sermon Will Be Preached—Class Day Exercises on Tuesday—An Alumni Association Will Be Organized This Year.

The graduating class and teachers of the high school are beginning to consider that commencement week approaches and to make arrangements for the commencement program. The members of the class are busy with their separate parts, and the week is now mapped out in general, though the separate or individual assignments are not yet given out.

The first exercises of the series will occur on the Friday preceding commencement week proper, when the junior program will be rendered in the evening at Assembly hall.

On Sunday the week proper will begin with the baccalaureate sermon which will be preached in one of the churches in the morning. No action has been taken toward securing a speaker, though it is the intention to have some one from one of the large churches, or some prominent educator to deliver the address if possible.

Tuesday afternoon will be occupied by the class day exercises at the campus of the high school.

Wednesday evening the class will provide an address appropriate to the week by some prominent speaker from one of the large institutions of this state or of Washington.

Thursday will be commencement day, upon which will occur the graduating exercises of the high school class, while Friday evening the class of 1904 and the graduates prior to this year will meet for the formation of an alumni association. There are 13 members of this year's class, and there were 10 in last year's class, which will start the association with a membership of 23.

### "THE HUSKIN' BEE."

Cast of Seventy Characters in the Entertainment to Be Given Tomorrow Night.

Miss Clara Louise Thompson, who has charge of the "Huskin' Bee," which will be rendered at the Frazer tomorrow night, is well pleased with the progress made by the cast. There are about 70 people in the entertainment and the task of hearing rehearsals, drilling individual parts and making the many changes, necessitated by the removal of different ones at first enlisted, has been strenuous in the extreme.

Miss Thompson is enthusiastic in her work, and feels that Pendleton will do a faithful part toward building the Sacajawea monument, to which the receipts of this entertainment will be devoted.

The "Huskin' Bee" has been warmly received wherever presented and Miss Thompson feels that Pendleton, being one of the very best cities in the Northwest, will show deep interest in the entertainment.

Aside from the patriotic object for which the entertainment is to be given, it contains more fun and laughter to the hour than any rustic drama on the road.

### NEW SURGICAL EQUIPMENT.

Dr. Lynn K. Blakeslee Adds Valuable Fixtures to His Office.

Dr. Lynn K. Blakeslee has just set up at an expense of about a thousand dollars, a McIntosh static X-ray machine. With this machine comes the German tubes, Crooke's tubes, the ultra-violet tubes used in cases of cancer and lupus and other equipment.

He has also installed a Betz hot air machine for rheumatic troubles. To make room for his new apparatus he has rented two more rooms adjoining his office giving him four rooms. With his X-ray machine he can readily locate foreign bodies or broken bones. The McIntosh X-ray machine comes from Chicago and is a splendid example of the latest scientific construction.

Dr. Blakeslee contemplates, at some future time, the erection of a sanitarium here.

SCHOLARS CELEBRATE CARR ING OF THE BONDS.

Will Be Synonymous With the Celebration of May Day, and Will Be Characterized by Music, Speeches, Literary Exercises, Marching and General Jollifying—Details of the Occasion Are Being Worked Out.

The pupils of the public schools, led by the teachers, are now laying plans for the ratification of the bond vote and will celebrate the success of the campaign with a May Day celebration.

It has been decided, since May Day is generally observed as a half holiday by the schools with appropriate exercises, that this time it would be very fitting to celebrate the certainty of having new school buildings at the same time that the advent of May is observed.

In accordance with this plan, then, Prof. Conklin will arrange a program for the occasion, though it has not been yet decided on what day the exercises will be held. The first of May comes this year on Sunday, and for that reason the celebration will be held either on the Friday or Saturday preceding, or on the Monday following.

The program will be rendered either on the campus at the high school, or on the court house grounds and will consist of exercises and drills by the little folks, music by members of the school, and musicians from the town, and perhaps the band.

A short address will be given by some prominent citizen, showing the attitude of the people toward the schools and the bond issue; another address by a member of the school board, outlining the plans and hopes of the board in relation to the schools; and a short address of thanks delivered by one of the high school pupils, explaining the spirit in which the pupils of the school receive the gift of the added buildings, and their appreciation of the good will and efforts of the patrons of the schools.

The details of the program have not been worked out, but it is certain to be both interesting and appropriate.
