LA GRANDE MAN WRITES OF HISTORIC SPOT.

Letters From R. D. Hamilton, Formerly of Umatilla County, Who is a Delegate to the World's Sunday School Convention—Writes From Spot at Which Saint Paul Was Shipwrecked.

R. D. Hamilton of La Grande, who is one of Oregon's delegates to the World's Sunday school convention which is to be held in Jerusalem, has written several letters of interest in regard to his journey, says the La Grande Chronicle. Miss Lora Richardson, his sister-in-law, is in receipt of a letter dated at Funchal, Madeira, March 16, in which Mr. Hamilton states:

"We arrived here today at 12 o'clock. We went over to Funchal at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and found Madeira island beyond what I expected to see. I have not been sick one minute, although I had cold and sore throat. The people are unusually friendly but some of them have been sick ever since we left New York. I will not attempt to tell you everything about my trip except that I would not have missed it for any amount of money."

"We have in our party some of the smartest men in the United States. We have fine music, singing, Sunday school and speaking every night. We had a smooth sea all the way except the first day. Our ship is one of the finest floating palaces on the water."

A letter of a later date was received yesterday by Mrs. Hattie Eckley. Mr. Hamilton stated that they had just arrived at Malta, the place where Apostle Paul was shipwrecked. The letter further gives a description of Algiers, which was the last stopping place before reaching Malta.

Mr. Hamilton says: "Algiers is a very peculiar city and is densely crowded. The streets are very narrow, from four to 40 feet wide. I did not know there was so much poverty in the world as there is here, and it only makes a person appreciate what a good fortune it is to live in the United States, which is the best country on earth."

"From Malta our next stop will be at Athens, Greece, where I will write to some other friends."
