LOCAL OPTION PEOPLE ASK FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT

Captain Mahone Spoke in Pendleton Sunday - Was With President Roosevelt in Cuba - Says Pendleton Lacks Enthusiasm-Will Put Every City and County Official on Record - Must Be Either for or Against the Law.

Captain L. D. Mahone, who left this morning for The Dalles, in the interest of the local option amendment, and who spoke in the Presbyterian church in this city Sunday morning, was a captain in President Roosevelt's regiment in Cuba.

He is also an ordained minister of the Methodist church and an active He is employ temperance lecturer. ed by the Anti-Saloon League of Or egon to make the present campaign for the local option amendment and for stricter law enforcement.

Speaking of Pendleton, he said to the East Oregonian that this city did not compare in enthusiasm to other Eastern Oregon towns, in favor of temperance. He related his experi ences in the city of Union, in Union

In that city the women's clubs had made efforts to enforce the Sun-day closing law and the law against gambling, but had utterly failed be-cause of the lethargy of the city council in lending assistance. Finally they sent for Mahone, who

went into the fight personally, for Sunday closing and closed gambling. He brought charges against the leading saloon for keeping open on Sunday and was beaten in two cases, because of a flaw in ...e city ordinance. He was not discouraged, but brought the third charge against the same man, and in this case was suc-The case was heard before Judge Eakin, in the circuit court and the Sunday closing law was unhold. and now the city of Union is closed tight as a drum on Sunday and not a game is running unless it is behind closed and locked doors, where the police cannot find it.

Captain Mahone says the laws of Oregon on these subjects are stronger than in a majority of cases, but enforcement is woefully lax. If the law was enforced in half the violations, Oregon would compare favorably to other states, from a moral standpoint.

In Ashland, the local option people elected the city officials, closed down the gambling and shut up all the joints on Sunday. In Roseburg gambling was closed and a temperance city administration elected.

The same crusade is now being

carried on in Eastern Oregon. Anti-Saloon League now has charges filed against Sam White, district attorney in Baker. Union and Wallowa counties, for disregard of the law against gambling. The case will be

At The Dalles charges will be brought against the city officials for not enforcing the laws against gambling, and before the state election occurs, the league expects to have every city in the state either for or against local option, and will have placed them on record. They will work in every county in the state and will bring charges against every official who does not enforce the laws on the statute books.

All they ask is that the present laws be enforced and the local option amendment to the constitution be passed to permit each community to select its own moral surroundings.
