Senator Nelson Grows Over the Government Delay-Recites the Resources of That Vast Territory and Laments the Woeful Lack of Appreciation of the Government.

Washington, April 21.—The confer report on the army appropriation bill was read and discussed and laid over until tomorrow. The discussion turned on the need of wagon in Alaska. Senator Nelson saying there was not a single wagon road in that territory and Senator Teller asserting that if \$500,000 could be spent in the building of such roads there would be a rich return in the

Senator Nelson predicted that with in the next generation Aiaska would have a population of a million.

Senator Nelson related many details of his observation in Alaska while visiting the country as a mem-

ber of the senate committee, and aroused much interest as he told of its resources, the hardships to which the settlers are subjected and the littie that had been done for the people He grew especially zealous in his

presentation of the production precious metals, furs, etc., and his zeal in this connection was scarcely exceeded by the indignation he exhibited as he depicted the niggard of the government in dealing with the Alaskans. At last, completety forgetting himself, he exclaimed: All this they have done, Mr. Pres ident, and in return we have no done a d-n thing for them."

The statement was a surprise to stories down an areaway and was the speaker as to his audience. There seldom has been as spontaneous an outburst of laughter in the senate as the exclamation provoked. Senator Nelson joined in the merriment. with many evidences of emthough harrassment. His only apology was the remark that "sometimes adjectives came from the heart," and wit that he closed his speech.
