



Canada's Trade Increases.

Ottawa, Ont., April 23.-Canada's aggregate foreign trade for the nine months ended March 31, amounted to \$345,307,651 or \$14,832,238 more than for the same period of the year previous. This is on the basis of im ports for consumption and exports, and includes coin and buillion. The imports for the past nine months totailed \$175.523,000 as against \$155, 440,036 last year and the exports amounted to \$155,064,155 as against \$162,420,763






