Sixth-This class struggle between the wealth makers and the wealth yards profit continues.

Seventh-In this conflict between the workers and the capitalists, labor is disarmed on the economic side, all the instruments of produccapital.

Eighth-There is only one weapon with which the working class can successfully oppose the capitalist class-and that is the ballot.

Ninth-This fact demands as an inevitable conclusion the organizalitical party that shall be, everywhere and always, distinct from and founded entirely upon the interests of the working class. The socialist party is organizing to meet this demand, and is, therefore, the party of the working class.
