## FOR PUBLIC MORALS

NATIONAL MUNICIPAL LEAGUE MEETS IN CHICAGO.

Lovers of Good Government From All Over the Country Discuss Plan for Better Municipal Moral Conditions—Taxation One of the First Fruitful Subjects of Discussion—Professors and Ministers From Leading Colleges and Universities Take Part.

Chicago, April 27.—The national Municipal League and the National Conference for Good City Government are celebrating the completion of the first decade of their existence with the largest and most notable conference ever held under their auspices. The objects of the league are to combine the forces of all who realize that it is only by united action and organization that good laws may be obtained, and the selection of men of trained ability and proved integrity for all municipal positions or prevent the success of incompetent or corrupt candidates for public office.

Another object is to promote the thorough investigation and discussion of the conditions and details of civic administration and of the methods for selecting and appointing officers in American cities and of laws and ordinances relating to such subjects.

The growth of the movement in the last 10 years is shown by the fact that when the league was organized in 1894 there were less than 50 local organizations giving either part or all of their attention to municipal affairs, while now there are 600 of these local associations throughout the country.

Well known municipal reformers from more than two score cities of the country filled the auditorium of the Northwestern University building this afternoon when the conference was formally called to order by the president, Charles J. Bonaparte of Baltimore. Mayor Carter H. Harrison and Frank H. Scott, president of the City Club of Chicago, gave cordial welcome to the visitors. For latter response was made by Charles Richardson, of Philadelphia, one of the pioneers of the municipal reform movement.

The first feature of the program was the annual report of the secretary, Clinton Rogers Woodruff of Philadelphia. In the course of his remarks Mr. Woodruff reviewed the important municipal happenings of the last year and commented in an interesting manner upon their significance.

The reports of the other officers and committees followed. Professor F. H. H. Roberts of the University of Denver presented a paper on "The Denver Situation and the Rush Amendment." Professor Roberts explained in an interesting manner the efforts of the city of Denver to make use of the power granted by the Rush amendment to draft and adopt its own charter.

"The St. Louis School Board, an Instance of Successful Home Rule," was the subject of a paper by Charles Nagel of St. Louis, and the concluding paper of the afternoon session was presented by Dr. Ellis P. Oberholtzer of Philadelphia, who took as his topic, "Home Rule Provisions in American Municipal Charters."

Municipal taxation has been selected as the general subject for the open meeting this evening and there will be a symposium of papers by President James of Northwestern University; Lawson Purdy, secretary of the Tax Reform Association, and others who have made a special study of the subject. The sessions of the conference will continue until Saturday.

### ARMY OFFICER SUICIDES.

Lieutenant Victor Lewis, of San Francisco, Leaves a Note and Disappears.

San Francisco, April 26.—Despite the close search in the hills near the Presidio, no trace of Lieutenant Victor Lewis, who disappeared after writing a note to a local newspaper, intimating his intention of suiciding, and that his body would be found near old Fort Point, no trace of him was found today.

Horsemen and parties on foot began searching at daylight, but met with no success.

### Colorado Postmasters.

Denver, Col., April 27.—The Postmasters' Association of Colorado, which was organized a year ago, is holding its annual convention in Denver today. Boulder, Pueblo, Colorado Springs, Manitou, Fort Collins and other cities of the state are represented at the meeting.

### Geinty Loses by Auditor's Theft.

The suit brought by the American Bridge company to compel Whitman county to pay the amount of a claim that was once allowed but unlawfully collected by Auditor C. G. Raby, and for which Raby is now serving a term in the penitentiary, has resulted in victory for the company in the state supreme court.

The company's claim was for \$1,753 for the construction of a steel bridge over the Palouse river. The county commissioners in 1901 approved the claim and ordered the auditor to issue a warrant in payment therefor. Raby drew the warrant, then forged the bridge company's endorsement and collected the money from the county treasurer, Walla Walla Statesman.
