TRIAL RUNS MADE TO

TEST THE MACHINERY.

Full Force Will Be Put at Work May 1, and Later the Force Will Be Reinforced to Handle the New Wool Crop-Four Carloads of Wool Arrived Yesterday - Prices Range From 10 to 13 Cents.

The scouring mills started up yes terday morning for a trial run, with a force of 10 sorters and six or seven apprentices. The start was made at this time more to get the machinery into running order before the opening of Monday, than for any reason that demanded immediate operation.

On Monday more men will be put to work and the real start in the season's business will be made. When everything is in running order the mill will have about 20 men at vork and this will be increased as the wool comes in and the business egins to rush.

The machinery has all been over hauled and put into as good shape as could be, so that there will be no delays in the middle of the season, when time is more valuable. All the machinery was put into operation this morning and found to be workwell. It will have but little rest rom now on for several months, and is this continuous strain that rankes it so necessary to go over it thoroughly every time the mill is thut down for a time.

Pour cars of wool from Arlington

vere shipped into the mill yard yesterday afternoon and unloaded, and by the time this is out of the way more will be ready, so there is now enough material in sight to keep things running until the end of the eason.

Owing to the wet weather of the past week the shearing in this part of the country has been held up, and he mills will have to make the opening run on wool shipped in from the

The mills are now paying from 10 to 13 cents for wool, and are finding nil that they wish at those figures as fast as it is taken from the backs of the sheep

J. M. Russell, the manager, was in town yesterday and visited the premises, looking over and mapping out the work. He left this morning for Portland and The Dalles, where he will remain most of his time, coming

The management of the scouring plant at this city and at The Dalles s both in his hands, though he will leave the direction of the mill here to his foremon, Fred S. Dobson, who has come from Lawrence, Mass., to ake charge of the sorting and grading department.

STRENGTH OF METHODISM.

Over 27,000,000 Adherents to the Different Methodist Churches in the United States.

A dispatch from San Francisco, convocation says of the recent Bishops of the Methodist church, in that city:

"All of the bishops submitted to the convention formal reports of the church's condition in their respective official jurisdictions. From ments it is shown that the Methodist Episcopal caurch in the United States has 15,000 ordained ministers and 28,000 church edifices. Seventy conferences are held annually, which 1,500,000 laymen are directly

concerned. The church has 3,150,000 cbmmunicants and 12,000,000 constituents. All other forms of Methodism in this country, including the M. E. church, South, have an additional 12,000,600 of communicants and constituents, making the grand total of believers 27,150,000.

"Partial progress was made in assigning bishops to preside over the 70 fall conferences this year and some work was also done in prepar-ing the program for the M. E. church general conference in Los Angeles

next month. During the conference each of the 15 bishops who are attending will de-liver at least one formal address an Hazard's pavilion in May, when the

conference will be held. "One feature of the Los Angeles conference will be the reception to foreign delegates, another a concert of Harry Barnhart, with a chorus of 700 voices, an orchestra of 60 pieces and a number of well known soloists in the production of selections from oratorios.
