

750 DELEGATES FROM

History Women Will Sit as Dele-New Bishops to Be Elected-Reorganization of Benevolences.

Los Angeles, Cal., May 3.-Nearly all of the delegates have arrived for general conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, which is to begin its quadrennial session in this city tomorrow. The delegates number about 750 and represent the 3-000,000 members of the church scattered throughout the world. For the first time in the 120 years' history of the church, women will hold seats in the body as delegates. This revolution is the result of action taken at the session of the general conference held in Chicago four years ago. addition to the delegates the conference has attracted thousands of visi tors from all parts of the United States who are interested in the proceedings.


