SCHOOL ATHLETICS

HIGH SCHOOL TRACK TEAM IS PRACTICING.

Will Try Out for Competition at Walla Walla and Baker City—Participants in Those Events Not Yet Selected, But There is Much Good Material to Choose From—Personnel of Rivals in the Different Branches of Athletics.

The track team of the high school is now beginning to shape itself for the coming interscholastic contests at Baker City.

A team of eight men will be taken to Walla Walla one week from today to compete with the Walla Walla high school, and last night part of the men on the local field had their try-out to fix the team. There is great rivalry among the athletes as to who will be able to take the Walla Walla trip, and the contests that were held last night and those which will be held this evening and tomorrow, were and are characterized by determination to win.

The school this year has a goodly number of promising applicants for places on the team, and all have been working hard to get into the best possible shape. From now on the work will be more systematic and will bring better results, for heretofore each man has had more than one event that he was trying to make good in. After the try-out of this week each man will be put in that event or events to which he is best adapted, and will be put through a course of training to develop all there is in him for the big meet the last of this month.

It is not yet possible to tell who will be sent to Walla Walla next week, from the list of those who have been training for the different events as all of them will in all probability represent the school when it goes to the field day the last of the month. DECLINES NOMINATION.

I. T. Mayfield Cannot Accept Offer of Baker County Democrats.

The democratic nominee for sheriff of Baker county, I. T. Mayfield, has tendered his resignation to the chairman of the county central committee and it will be acted upon at once.

For the past 17 years Mr. Mayfield has been in the employ of the O. R. & N. railway as engineer, and in a short time, under the rule of the company, he will come in for a pension.

His present salary is larger than he could hope to receive from the sheriff's office if elected, and to leave the road would mean the abandonment of a sure position never to be regained, for an uncertainty.

He is now the seventh oldest man in the engine department on the mountain division in point of service, and is now eligible to a passenger engine, although he has declined to give up his helper run at Pleasant Valley, for a passenger run.

His salary amounts to \$135 per month, and he works 12 hours per day, the helpers being "double crewed."

He is an enthusiastic horseman and owns a fine farm at Pleasant Valley, where his family lives. He came to the O. R. & N. in 1887 from the C. B. & Q. road, Nebraska, being one of a party of seven engineers from the "Q." to begin work for the O. R. & N. at the same time.

To Elect Hanna's Successor.

New York, May 6.—The executive committee of the National Civic Federation began its annual meeting today at the federation's headquarters in this city. The principal business of the meeting is to elect a successor to the late Senator Hanna, as president of the Civic Federation. Francis L. Robbins, president of the Pittsburgh Coal Company, is prominently mentioned for the honor.
