Business Dull. Hundreds of buildings that are erected here, nearly all the lumber business is slow.

Secretary of the Lumbermen's Association, says the lumber business in the mills think that it is because lumber is cheaper they have to do more work.

Washington Mill Company re-opens business locally is good, owing to the late spring demand is not good.

William Messer Lumber & Milling Company reports that business is not as good as last year time but that it is pretty good and will pick up again in a few weeks.
