OBJECTS TO PHELPS.

Albert Tozier of Salem Recalls Costly Extra Session Blunder.

"Salem, Ore., May 15.—(Editor East Oregonian.)—Following is a clipping taken from a paper in Morrow county:

"The republicans of Morrow and Umatilla counties, in selecting G. W. Phelps of Heppner, for the office of prosecuting attorney for the Sixth district, have acted wisely. Mr. Phelps had no opposition, it being generally conceded that no better man could be selected for this important place. He is a man of ability and a good lawyer, and will attend strictly to the business of the office."

DEATH ON RAILROADS.

Over 400 People Killed and 3178 Injured Last Year.

Reports from the interstate commerce commission from the railroads of the United States show that for the three months ending December 31, 1903, there were 446 persons killed in train accidents and 3178 injured. In other than train accidents on railroads and in the yards of the roads there were a total of 991 killed and 11,382 injured. This includes passengers, trainmen and all others, and all sorts of accidents.

Derrailment is the most frequently destructive to life of all accidents. The passage of the act of congress requiring all railroads in the country to report their accidents to the interstate commerce commission was dated March 3, 1901, and the quarter under consideration shows a larger number of fatalities than any previous similar length of time in the past 15 years. During the quarter there were 1832 collisions and 1179 derrailments, of which number 287 collisions and 119 derrailments affected passenger trains, and the damage to cars, engines and roadway amounted to \$2,527,000.
