SEATS AT ST. LOUIS

DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL CONVENTION WILL BE JAMMED.

Over 10,000 Admission Tickets Will Be Given Out—Press Will Be Represented by 245 Working Reporters, Who Have Been Assigned Special Quarters—Room for 650 Guests in Reserved Sections—Galleries Will Hold 4500.

The seating of the Coliseum for the democratic national convention at St. Louis, has been fixed at 10,840, which includes delegates, alternates, representatives of the press, invited guests, officials of the convention and the general public who will be admitted by ticket.

The preliminary arrangements for the organization of the convention are in the hands of W. A. De Ford of Kansas, who has established headquarters at the Hotel Jefferson, representing the sub-committees of the national committee.

Provisions will be made for 245 working newspapermen who will be seated in correspondents' section 1 and 2. Seats are provided for 350 additional newspapermen who will occupy press sections 1 and 2.

The arena floor will be so arranged that the delegates to the number of 950, will be seated directly in front of the platform. Behind will be the 950 alternates. Further back will be two "guests" sections, in which will be accommodations for 662.

The more important guests and the party leaders will have seats on the platform where there will be places for 434.

The boxes will seat 420. The general tickets of admission will be for the balcony and gallery. In the balcony will be 4490 seats and the gallery will have places for 2880.

Under arrangements as they stand at present each member of the national committee will have at his disposal one box and ten general admission tickets.

Each delegate will have his own ticket of admission and three general tickets in addition. Each alternate will have one ticket. The seats for guests will be in the hands of the sub-committee on arrangements.

PREPARING FOR ENCAMPMENT.

Over Four Thousand Men Expected to Drill.

General Funston, commander of the department of the Columbia, and his military associates, have left for Vancouver, after a two days' inspection of the encampment site of the regular army and the national guardsmen at American lake. Within a week, it is stated, General Funston will furnish a program covering all the military maneuvering, camp instructions for guardsmen and the routine for the July encampment.

Seattle advices quote him as stating there will be about 4500 men in the encampment. He has decided on the field disposition of the troops. Both regulars and guardsmen will be divided into two brigades. The headquarters of General Funston, the staff officers and the umpires will be located at Camp Murray.

About two miles down American lake, at what is known as the Huggins place, a brigade of 2500 regulars and guardsmen will be stationed. About one mile from the Stellacoom asylum, on a beautiful plain through which meanders a creek, on the road running from Tacoma to Stellacoom the remaining 2000 regulars and guardsmen will be stationed.

One of the brigades, General Funston states, will be under the command of Col. Godfrey of the Ninth cavalry, stationed at Walla Walla, and the other will be under Col. Huston of the Nineteenth infantry, stationed at Vancouver. The two brigades will simulate hostility, and the country between them will be the scene of continual fighting. It is probable there will be several night marches with attempts at surprises, although there will be no general sham battle.

VICTORY FOR LAFOLLETTE.

Arch-Enemy of Monopolies Wins Out in Wisconsin.

Madison, Wis., May 18.—Victorious in one of the hardest political fights ever seen in Wisconsin, Governor LaFollette is in full control of the republican state convention here today and his renomination is conceded on all sides. So far as it goes the victory is complete, but lively times are yet to come if the governor attempts to dictate the selection of delegates at large to the national convention. His aim is to prevent Senators Spooner and Quarles from going to Chicago as delegates at large, and were he able to control the Wisconsin delegation he would lose no time in retiring Henry C. Payne from the republican national committee. It is not believed, however, that his power will extend that far.

The platform will express commendation of the wise, patriotic and progressive administration of President Roosevelt, to whom promise will be made of renewed allegiance and support. In regard to state issues the resolutions will declare for a railroad rate commission, equalization of taxes and indorsement of the primary election law, which will be voted on at the fall election.
