


The best result record for 1903 was secured by a farmer of Otero county, Colorado. He grew one acre of sugar beets at a cost of about \$37.50; the yield of beets was 33 tons, for which he received \$158, his net returns being about \$130.

The amount of sugar made from the beet crop of 1903 was 240,604 tons, as compared with 218,405 tons from the crop of 1902, and 184,605 tons from that of 1901.

Within the past few years there has been a remarkable increase in the percentage of sugar in the beets.


