GENERAL NEWS.

The United States transport Solace has sailed from San Francisco for the Philippines with 600 soldiers and 300 tons of ammunition.

John Mitchell is using his utmost endeavors to induce the Western Federation of Miners to affiliate with the American Federation of Labor.

Mrs. R. H. Battersby, aged 60, of Enumclaw, Wash., while in St. Louis visiting the fair, blew out the gas when she retired, with the usual fatal result.

Francis P. Hennessey, a very wealthy mining man of New Mexico, has disappeared in New York City. He is known to have had \$3,000 cash upon his person when last seen.

T. B. Thomas, a prominent business man of Pasadena, Cal., 35 years of age, stabbed and killed his 8-year-old son and then killed himself with a pistol. Homicidal mania, inherited.

There are 81 trust companies in New York, capitalized at \$200,000,000 and controlling deposits of over \$800,000,000. A movement is on foot to consolidate them into one organization.

William Strickland, a deserter from the Vancouver barracks, Washington, tired of dodging the officers and surrendered at Astoria Sunday.

The Boise City assay office has just computed Idaho's mineral output for 1903, showing the production of all kinds of minerals to be \$29,451,933.

The postoffice safe at Dewey, Idaho, was blown to atoms Saturday night, but no booty was secured. This is the third safe blown in that vicinity recently.

Suit has been brought by the state portage commission against I. H. Taffe, for a right of way through Taffe's land for the state portage road, at The Dalles.

Governor Chamberlain said at Astoria Saturday that Mayor George B. McClellan, of New York City, would unite all factions of the democrats as a presidential candidate.

Thomas Myers shot and instantly killed George Brownlee and fatally wounded Wallace Jarrett on Salmon river, near Lewiston, Idaho, Saturday. The shooting was done from ambush.
