

AVOIDING OSWALD WEST IS AFTER

PUBLIC LAND GRAFTERS.

New Set of Affidavits Formulated to Prevent Fraud-Notices Sent Out to Purchasers That Their Filings Had \$5.848.87. Been Cancelled-Many People Taking Advantage of New Plan.

Salem, Or., May 24,-State Land Agent Oswald West is probably leading as strenuous a life as did any incumbent ever in the office, and just at the present time his efforts are for the benefit of those who have purchased lieu land trom the state, based upon school land sections which were alleged to be mineral in character, but which have been disapproved and held for cancellation by the interior

department. The state land board has taken the matter in hand and will assist such as made purchases in good faith, and following questions: to this end a system has been adopt-ed by the board to enable those people to obtain title from the United

States with certainty and dispatch. State Land Agent West has formulated a set of blanks. the first 10 which is a notice to the purchaser from the state that the land covered by his purchase form a part of what has been held for cancellation by the commissioner of the general land office on account of defective base, and the state title has therefore failed.

This is malled with a form for making application for the repayment of money paid to the state. The latter blank is also an affidavit, setting forth the facts and certifying that the deed received from the state is returned, and that the land has not been sold or incumbered.

This is fortified by an affidavit from the county clerk showing that the land is not encumbered. Upon the return of these blanks, properly filled out and signed, a certificate in which the right and title of the state are re with this paper the applicant can go to the United States land office and make application for the same land. either by offering scrip, homestead or other form.

This is a great saving to the entry man in time and traveling expenses and allows him to procure the land a government figures, whereas under the old state law the price of lieu land was \$2.50 per acre, and this price has since been increased, making the minimum price \$5 per acre.

In order to make a new purchase from the state an additional amount of \$2.50 would have to be paid. Many people are taking advantage of this new plan and perfecting their papers as rapidly as possible.

The state land agent is now prepar ing a list of the available base in the state, and when completed the per-sons desiring to purchase will no longer be compelled to pay a commis-

WHY DOES CORN POP?

Agricultural Questions Answered by the Department.

A New Yorker recently submitted to the department of agriculture the

1. Why does popcorn pop? 2. Why doesn't ordinary corn pop like pop corn? 3. What is the composition of popcorn and why does it differ from ordinary corn? 4. Why does popcorn pop better when thoroughly dry? The department made an investigation and repied as follows

1. The popping of popcorn is due to volatilization of the oil contained in the kernel.

Field corn does not pop as readi-2. ly as popcorn pops because the outer portion of the kernel is more porous, permitting the escape of the oll as it volatizes, while in the case of popcorn a great pressure is developed in the kernel by the confined oil and the kernel is suddenly exploded and turned wrong side out.

In composition popcorn differs 830 from ordinary corn in having a larger proportion of corneous element and a greater per cent of oll.

Popcorn pops more readily when dry because when moistened the ker nels are swollen, more porous and linquished to the United States, and toughened and do not explode so suddenty and completely as when dry and hard


