



Yaquina bay is to become famed as a producer of new oysters. A carload of Eastern bivalves has just been planted there. H. G. VanDusen, state fish warden, has returned from the ovster beds and tells about it.

"A new industry has been started in Oregon." said he. "There is every reason to believe that Yaquina will soon become famous for its new product as is Toke Point. And Yaquina's success with undoubtedly bring Coos bay and other Oregon hays into the same industry.

That the Eastern denizens will thrive in their new home is evidenced by the sturdy growth of specimens transplanted from the Atlantic seaboard in November, 1896, when H. D.

McGuire was fish warden. The oysters then introduced in Oregon waters, 25 barrels, have been growing ever since but do not propagate. When planted nearly eight years ago they were about the size of a dollar. Since then they have expanded to prodigous size. The specimens brought back by Mr. VanDusen yesterday were about five inches long by three inches wide

The oysters spawn sure enough; but the spat succumbs to adverse conditions of its new habitat-commonly supposed to be coldness of the water. At any rate, Yaquina Bay, like Willapa or Shoalwater Bay, is not adapted to propagation of the Eastern oyster, though the imported bivalve itself seems to rejoice in the new home.

Consequently it will be necessary constantly to plant the Yaquina beds with Eastern "seed," as is done at Toke Point. Many carloads of seed are brought over the continent from the Atlantic side to Toke Point every year and an extensive industry has grown from meager beginnings

The oysters planted at Yaquina in 1896 attained their full growth four years ago, since then the shell has simply thickened and grown heavy. Though the month of May does not contain the letter "R" in its spelling, the specimens exhibited by Mr. Van-Dusen were in excellent condition for the epicure. The oysters have been under the supervision of the state biologist for experiment purposes and under the immediate care of George King, of Winant.




