**Another Paper Railroad.**  
 The committee on Antelope, it is expected, will complete the arrangement of the range lines this week and if the territory which they map out for the ranging of the sheep and cattle during the summer months is observed there will be no trouble. A committee of cattlemen from the southern part of the county will be present to meet the sheepmen and it is expected that an amicable adjustment of the matter will be effected.

**County Fair for Baker.**  
 Baker City will now have fair grounds and a race track, says the Baker City Herald.  
 A committee is looking out for the location and the hopes of Baker City are about at last to be realized.  
 This is Baker county's year for the \$1500 from the state and she is going to make good use of it.  
 A mass meeting was held at the court house last night, which was attended by a large number of citizens from over the county and at which the sentiment was universal for the building of a race track and fair grounds near Baker City. It is the most accessible point for the people throughout the county, and they are going to prepare a place to exhibit their products and a place to meet for pleasure and recreation.

**Fixing Range Limits.**  
 The committee of sheepmen, appointed some time ago by the Antelope Woolgrowers' Association, consisting of Murdo J. Finlayson, John Lellan and John Radigan, passed through the city the last of the week on their way to the Blue Mountain country, where they went to establish stock lines for the coming summer. The range question which has always been a source of trouble between the cattle and sheepmen and this year has been taken to prevent, so far as possible, any disturbance arising from a dispute over range territory.

**Aid Suffering Woman.**  
 In response to the appeal over 100 persons yesterday volunteered to give some of their cuticle to assist the physicians in their attempt to save the life of Mrs. William Nave. About 50 appeared at the hospital, but the doctors and nurses were only able to accommodate 35. The condition of Mrs. Nave was reported today to be much improved and the physicians state that if the volunteers continued at the same rate as yesterday they will only require a week to have the burned portion of the woman completely covered with cuticle.—Walla Walla Statesman.

## YAQUINA OYSTERS

**EASTERN BIVALVES ARE TRANSPLANTED THERE.**  
 Do Not Propagate, But Grow to Immense Size—Twenty-Five Barrels of Small Oysters Were Transplanted From the East in 1896 and Have Done Finely Removal is Effected Each Year in May.  
 Yaquina bay is to become famed as a producer of new oysters. A carload of Eastern bivalves has just been planted there. H. G. VanDusen, state fish warden, has returned from the oyster beds and tells about it.  
 "A new industry has been started in Oregon," said he. "There is every reason to believe that Yaquina will soon become famous for its new product as is Toko Point. And Yaquina's success with undoubtedly bring Coos bay and other Oregon bays into the same industry."  
 That the Eastern denizens will thrive in their new home is evidenced by the sturdy growth of specimens transplanted from the Atlantic seaboard in November, 1896, when H. D. McGuire was fish warden. The oysters then introduced in Oregon waters, 25 barrels, have been growing ever since, but do not propagate. When planted nearly eight years ago they were about the size of a dollar. Since then they have expanded to prodigious size. The specimens brought back by Mr. VanDusen yesterday were about five inches long by three inches wide.  
 The oysters spawn sure enough; but the spat succumbs to adverse conditions of its new habitat—commonly supposed to be coldness of the water. At any rate, Yaquina Bay, like Willapa or Shoalwater Bay, is not adapted to propagation of the Eastern oyster, though the imported bivalve itself seems to rejoice in the new home.  
 Consequently it will be necessary constantly to plant the Yaquina beds with Eastern "seed," as is done at Toko Point. Many carloads of seed are brought over the continent from the Atlantic side to Toko Point every year and an extensive industry has grown from meager beginnings.  
 The oysters planted at Yaquina in 1896 attained their full growth four years ago, since then the shell has simply thickened and grown heavy. Though the month of May does not contain the letter "R" in its spelling, the specimens exhibited by Mr. VanDusen were in excellent condition for the epicure. The oysters have been under the supervision of the state biologist for experiment purposes and under the immediate care of George King, of Winant.
