DO NOT FAVOR LOCAL OPTION

RETAIL LIQUOR DEALERS OBJECT TO MEASURE.

Association Makes Reply to the Local Option People and Recites Many Reasons Why They Oppose the Amendment—Provisions of the Law as Proposed Are Not Fair.

The local organization of the Retail Liquor Dealers' Association has issued a circular letter to the voters, in answer to the circulars of the local option adherents and is now conducting an educational campaign against local option.

The circular is as follows: To the Voters of Umatilla County: The local option law to be voted on at the election to be held on June 6 should, on account of its evil features, meet with condemnation at the hands of the voters, such as its provisions warrant.

Section 1 provides that 10 per cent of the voters may call an election in any county or precinct or the counties or precincts may be bunched or gerrymandered so as to give prohibitionists an opportunity to force an adjoining non-prohibition precinct into a yearly turmoil in the shape of an election. We have enough elections now and it seems unfair to add another burden on the unwilling majority. Is this local option?

Section 10 of the act again is glaringly unfair. It provides that even if a county's vote is against prohibition any precinct that has cast a vote for prohibition shall be declared prohibition. But it does not work the other way. If any county votes for prohibition, it does not matter whether any precinct in it voted against the question or not, no liquor business can be conducted anywhere in the county.

Is this local option? If so, is this fair? At the election in 1900 the prohibitionists of Oregon cast 2536 votes out of a total of 84,116. Can about 3 per cent of the voters consistently ask the passage of such legislation and call it local option?

Section 3 gives the liquor dealer about three weeks to close up his business and move such as has not been by this act confiscated. Is not this a rather summary method?

Section 14 says that when a county has declared for prohibition, no election on this question can be held in any precinct of the county thereafter, until prohibition has been defeated at a subsequent election held for the entire county. Yet the act provides that on a petition of 10 per cent of the voters the prohibs may hold an election in any precinct every year. Is this fair?

Suppose a provision existed in the act that no election should be held if those opposed to its passage should file a petition of double the amount or 20 per cent of the voters. Do you think that it would be hard to get the signatures, Mr. Voter? If those who are opposed to the act qualify in double the amount of the list required would not that appear fair?

Mr. Voter of Umatilla county, we ask you in justice and equity before you saddle this piece of legislation on the state of Oregon, to get a copy of the act, read it over and you will find many objectionable features that we have not space to point out. Don't take our word, don't take any person's word, get the act itself at the court house or write to us and we will send one to you by the next mail.

Atlanta, Georgia, had 254 stores vacated on her principal streets by local option, and Texas, under a law from which this act is taken, is at present in a deplorable condition. The adoption of the act will throw 15,000 men out of employment in the state of Oregon, while, as above stated, the total vote for prohibition in 1900 was 2536. Apathy of the voters and the misleading title of the act is the stronghold of its supporters.

In 1890 the total vote cast for president was 13,959,652, of which 208,914 was for the prohibition candidate, or about one and one-half per cent, while Mr. Frederick H. Winsor, United States statistician gives for homicide the following figures, June 1, 1890: (The 1900 statistics are not yet ready, so we give the latest we could find.) Number of homicides, 7386, of which 973 are of habits unknown as to intoxicating liquors; 1282 total abstainers; 3829 moderate drinkers; 1,267 drunkards.

As the total abstainers, as shown by all the elections are a very small percentage of the people, and as they furnish 20 per cent of the grave crime of homicide, it would appear that liquor was not one of the gravest motives of such crimes.

On June 1st, 1890, the male insane were 53,473; female, 53,012, or approximately equal, yet no one will contend that women drink as much as men. From three to five per cent go insane from liquor, so students of the subject say, yet as L. J. Adair, of the Iowa Criminal Insane hospital says: "Prohibition did not lessen the number of the insane."

While it may be true that liquor does cause insanity it is only one of many causes. Religious enthusiasm is perhaps a more potent factor, as witness in Oregon the organization known as "Holy Rollers."

That is the scope of the proposed law and if you adopt it, while it may injure the retail liquor interests to such an extent that the present people will probably leave the state, it will equally, if not more, inflict irreparable injury on your heavy taxpayers and progressive men who are entirely apart and separate from the liquor interests.
