DEMOCRATIC HOPE

LEADERS EXPECT TO CONTROL THE NEXT CONGRESS.

Republican Majority in the House is Now 37—Loss of 17 Republicans Would Mean a Tie—Virginia Will Be Regained by the Democrats—Wisconsin May Give Democratic Returns Also.

Washington, May 31.—Democratic control of the next house of representatives, which will displace Speaker Cannon of Illinois and make him the leader of the minority, is forecasted by conservative democrats, who, while hopeful of the defeat of President Roosevelt, are not regarding that outcome of the campaign with as much assurance as the gain of 18 democratic votes in the house. At present the republican majority is 34. The loss of 17 republican members would make the house a tie.

The situation in Wisconsin causes the democrats to count upon gaining four members in that state. They figure that they will get three more in New York; certainly in the event the state goes democratic.

The factional trouble in the republican organization in West Virginia has encouraged them to count upon gaining two members in that state and the regain of control in Maryland substantially assures, they say, the loss of two of the four republican congressmen there.

In Virginia the republicans have one member, something unusual, and the democrats are confident this district will be regained. In Illinois the democrats are figuring upon holding their present strength and making inroads into the republican delegation to the extent of four members.

ILLINOIS REPUBLICANS.

Have Met After a Ten-Day's Recess, to Resume the Struggle.

Springfield, Ill., May 31.—After a recess of 10 days the delegates to the republican state convention reassembled here today to make another effort to agree upon a candidate for governor. Many rumors are afloat as to deals and combines, but nothing definite will be known as to whether there has been any decisive change in the situation until after the first ballot is taken.

The previous convention took 58 ballots without result and adjourned with Governor Yates in the lead, and Lowden, Dineen, Hamlin, Warner, Sherman and Pierce in the order named.

FAIR IS INCOMPLETE.

Correspondent Says St. Louis is Not Yet Seen at Her Best.

A. H. Harris, writing from St. Louis, says: "After spending four days in glancing over the world's fair I have gained several well founded impressions, but I do not claim to have seen the show. My first impression is that the fair is incomplete in all departments; secondly, the immense acreage covered is a disadvantage. Only immense crowds could justify the vast area taken up by buildings and exhibits.

"St. Louis has attempted to outdo the world in an international exhibition, and by July it will be completed and ready for inspection by visitors who will be forced to appreciate the magnitude and excellence of the displays gathered from every quarter of the world. The show is so large that the man who comes here and after spending a week goes home and claims to have seen the fair will be considered a graduate joker or cheerful liar."
