Law Not Wanted in Oregon.

IRONCLAD LAND CON-

Section 3. "The Irrigation company may at its option place and maintain at the point of delivery suitable meas-uring boxes or gates; the time and manner of delivering, measuring and regulating the supply to the purchaser shall be prescribed by the irrigation company, and shall be under its conadopt: the irrigation company may shut off the water in the canals at any brother. time that it may deem necessary to do so for repairs; and the purchaser for himself or his heirs and assigns agrees to waive and hereby does waive any and all claims for loss or damage resulting either from an in-sufficient or excessive supply of water. or from break, leakage or overflow any canal, main or lateral, regardless of the cause thereof."
